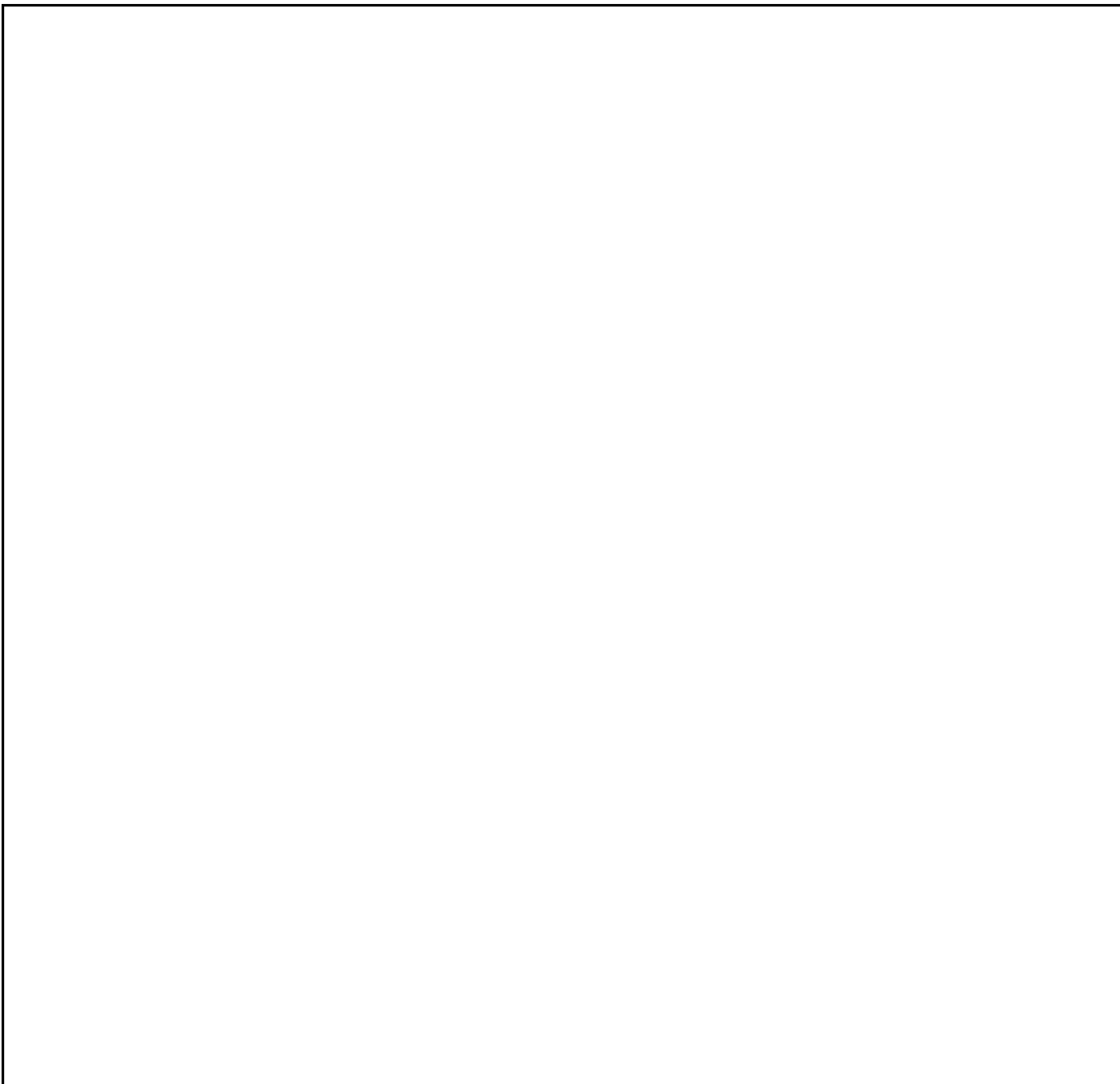

Sourwine, Chief Counsel, ~~Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Internal Security~~, to inform him that Anatole Davydov, the Soviet journalist who defected in Tokyo last weekend, was being handled by the Department of State as an emigre, [redacted] as a defector.
