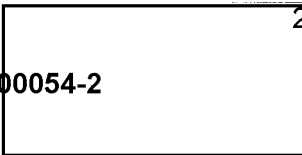

25X1 22. [REDACTED] Received a call from Jim Calloway, Senate Appropriations Committee staff, who asked when the sensitive project started and how much money was spent prior to August 1972. I told him it started in FY 1970. Calloway asked how much money was spent prior to Chairman McClellan taking over in August of 1972. [REDACTED] 25X1 who was also on the phone, said there was a paper coming up to Calloway which contained all this information. Calloway asked for it over the phone and [REDACTED] read it to him.

25X1 23. [REDACTED] Angus Thuermer called and said he received a call from Gerry Yenevitz, of Access Magazine, referring to a Senate Judiciary Constitutional Rights Subcommittee report, pages 2910 to 2915, entitled "Federal Data Banks and Constitutional Rights." Yenevitz wanted to know why CIA was putting information into FCC data banks. I told him we would get a copy of the document and look into it.

25X1 24. [REDACTED] Don Lynch, Senate Armed Services Committee staff, called and said he needed information on Soviet ocean surveillance capabilities. He said he wanted to know how effective they are in keeping track of our ships, etc., what means do they have for doing that--satellites or what. I told him we would have something for him by Monday. [REDACTED] 25X1 [REDACTED] is pulling something together on this.

[REDACTED] Called [REDACTED] D/Security, and told 25X1 him Larry Silberman, Justice Department, in a meeting of the ad hoc group this evening, said the Kastenmeier Subcommittee on Courts, Civil Liberties 25X1 and the Administration of Justice of House Judiciary Committee, had decided to release the [REDACTED] executive session testimony [REDACTED] Arrangements have been made for us to review the transcript this evening.

25X1 8. [REDACTED] Called Guy McConnell, Senate Appropriations Committee staff, and alerted him to the articles in Saturday's and today's NIDs on SALT and Vietnam respectively. We discussed Senator Stuart Symington's statement on [REDACTED]

25X1 [REDACTED] I said I didn't know how Chairman McClellan or Senator Young felt about this but if McConnell thought it would be a good idea for me to see either or both of them and fill them in I would. He said he did not think that was necessary. I told him the Director will not be making any statement on this. 25X1

25X1 9. [REDACTED] Called Frank Slatinshek, Chief Counsel, House Armed Services Committee, and alerted him to the articles in Saturday's and today's NIDs on SALT and Vietnam respectively.

Slatinshek asked how the Director was holding up under all the pressures. I said he was doing well but I was sure he was a little frustrated, especially over such articles as the Reston article this morning. Slatinshek said it upset him to see these things happen to Mr. Colby. He said Mr. Colby is the "most conscientious man" he ever knew, that he is "dedicated" and that what these people are talking about is history--it didn't happen on Mr. Colby's watch. He cannot understand why they hang it all on him. He said the only thing Mr. Colby could possibly be criticized for is he is too frank and candid and outgoing. He said he admires Mr. Colby very much and he thinks he is tougher than most people realize.

25X1 10. [REDACTED] Called Ralph Preston, House Appropriations Committee staff, and alerted him to the articles in Saturday's and today's NIDs on SALT and Vietnam respectively. He thanked me and said he would get them right away.

25X1 11. [REDACTED] Dale De Haan, Counsel, Subcommittee on Refugees and Escapees, Senate Judiciary Committee, called and said he had just returned from a six week trip through Africa and South Asia. He said he saw a reference to today's paper to a report "Potential Implications of Trends in World Population, Food Production and Climate." He said he would like to have a copy as it would fit in with the study the Subcommittee is doing. He also said he would like to talk to some of our people about the trip.

25X1 13. [redacted] In regard to his earlier request, called Jim Davidson, on the staff of the Subcommittee on Intergovernmental Relations, Senate Government Operations Committee, to confirm that an exhaustive search failed to reveal the existence of any [redacted] 25X1 agreement" between the FBI and CIA which was written in 1948. I referred him to a classified FBI memorandum dated 7 February 1966 prescribing the scope of CIA's activities in the United States. Davidson said he will request the document from the FBI. He explained that the Subcommittee needs this material in connection with their study to determine the jurisdiction of agencies within the intelligence community and the congressional oversight which was initiated in the closing days of the 93rd Congress. With the establishment of the Senate Select Committee to Study Governmental Operations with Respect to Intelligence Activities, however, no hearings will be held, though the study will be continued and coordinated with the Select Committee. Davidson added that he works closely with Bill Miller, the Staff Director. Davidson said he would be back in touch with us and would furnish us copies of any correspondence with the FBI.

[redacted] Marc Ginsberg, Staff Assistant, Senate Subcommittee on Refugees and Escapees, Senate Committee on the Judiciary, called and asked if we had any information concerning [redacted] 25X1 [redacted] of New York City who had visited Laos as a tourist in September 1974 and was captured by the Pathet Lao forces. According to Ginsberg, he was then on a boat with an Australian and an AID official. 25X1 After checking with [redacted] I called Ginsberg back and told him the Agency was aware of the circumstances but the only information we have has been provided by the State Department and I suggested he check with them. He said he would contact Sam Goldberg, Legislative Liaison at State, as well as someone in AID.

25X1 15. [redacted] Received a call from David Batt, Administrative Assistant to Representative Joe D. Waggoner, Jr. (D., La.), who wanted to report that the Representative was again in receipt of another letter from [redacted] concerning her appeal of the Agency's settlement of her claim for damaged household goods. Batt asked if [redacted] 25X1 letter to Mr. Brown, Chairman of the Claims Review Board, could be handled again 25X1 by [redacted] I told Batt I was sure this would be the way [redacted] would want to handle it, but we would get back in touch with him about this.
