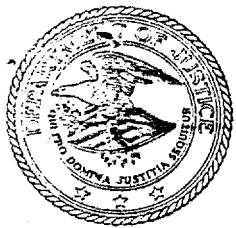

Dear Mr. Colby:

I am writing to acknowledge the agreement specified in your letter of June 5, 1975, concerning electronic surveillance by the Central Intelligence Agency. The agreement states that, consistent with the provisions of the draft National Security Council Intelligence Directive No. 9, the Central Intelligence Agency will not conduct electronic surveillance within the United States without the prior approval of the Attorney General. In addition, consistent with the aforementioned draft Directive and with your letter to the Attorney General dated July 20, 1974, the Central Intelligence Agency will undertake no electronic surveillance directed specifically at United States citizens abroad without the prior approval of the Attorney General.
