The 20th Congress of the CPSU... and the Soviet Government designed to improve relations... and develop cooperation with all countries on the basis of the Leninist principle of peaceful coexistence...

CPSU Congress February 1956 :

".... on the other hand, the forces working for peace... are gaining in strength in the world. They are developing an active struggle against the war danger and for the peaceful coexistence of states with different economic and social systems. The steady consolidation of the international camp of socialism.... is of decisive importance...."

WPC Bulletin December 1956 :

Full page devoted to an article entitled " A Success for Coexistence "in praise of the joint Soviet-Japanese declaration on restoration of relations between the two countries. Its concluding paragraph took another pot-shot at the USA by stating ", Simultaneous with the restoration of normal relations with the Soviet Union, there is a growing demand for revision of relations with the USA. This demand wants to see the principle of equal rights prevail..... The League for the Defense of the Japanese Constitution (note: Communist-dominated) has launched a big campaign to re-examine the treaties signed between Japan and the US that disregard equality of rights... The League has called for public support of the ' action month' it has just opened...."

Sept 1956 issue of the WPC Bulletin:

Mohamed Kamel el Bindari, member of WPC and former Egyptian Ambassador to USSR, "...and the slogans used by Nasser,.. were refusal to take any part in aggressive military pact; peaceful co-existence;...elimination of all vestiges of imperialism; defense of self-determination of all oppressed people; cooperation with all peoples in cultural and economic spheres; cooperation on the internat'l level to reduce tension and come to agreement on disarmament, the abolition of atomic weapons.... we are convinced that the ..support of forces of peace.... will make the partisans of force reflect...."
