KHRUSHCHEV: "...delegations from Communist and Workers' parties from 70 countries have come to our Congress."

1. The following information is available as of 5 February 1959. Of the 64 countries listed below, it remains doubtful whether Pakistan and Nicaragua sent delegates. If these two delegations were present, there would still be six delegations not yet firmly identified in KHRUSHCHEV's total count of 70. Certain possibilities are suggested at the end of the listing.
