AUSTRIA: Renewal of treaty negotiations suggested -- Austrian Foreign Minister Gruber has urgently suggested to US Lagation Vienna that, if an agreement is reached to re-open quadripartite discussion on Germany, the US propose a concurrent renewal of Austrian treaty negotiations. Gruber believes that a "favorable climate" for negotiations on Austria may result from the recent diplomatic talks with Stalin, and that the USSE would be prepared to accept a proposal of further Austrian treaty discussions. Gruber says that Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Vyshinsky has declared to a high-ranking Austrian diplomat that the USSR is eager for an Austrian treaty and that the only outstanding issue of direct concern to the UESR is that of the German assets in Austria.
