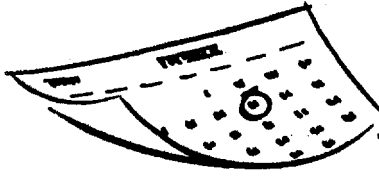

SEPT

- 1 Germany invades Poland; World War II begins. 1939.
- 8 Peace treaty with Japan signed by 48 nations in San Francisco but USSR, Czechoslovakia and Poland refuse to sign. 1951. Fifteenth anniversary.
- 8 Southeast Asia Treaty Organization (SEATO) formed. 1954.
- 9 Chicom troops enter Lhasa, capital of Tibet. 1951. Fifteenth Anniversary.
- 9 Dalai Lama appeals UN help restore independence of Tibet. 1959.
- 13 International Memorial Day for Victims of Fascism; week of International Struggle against Fascism and War 19-29 Sept. (International Federation of Resistance Movements -- Communist).
- 20 U.N. General Assembly, 21st Session, opens in New York.
- 23 Bulgaria. Nicola Petkov, Agrarian opposition leader, hanged. 1947.
- 24 Atlantic Charter endorsed by 15 anti-Axis nations, including USSR. 1941. Twenty-fifth anniversary.
- 26 International Symposium on the Adaptation of the Machine to Man (sponsored by the International Labor Organization) opens in Prague.
- 28 First International founded, London. 1864. USSR and Hitler Germany conclude Friendship and Boundary Treaty. 1939.
- WIDF sponsored conference in Nepal on Children, for Afghanistan, Nepal, India and Pakistan (Communist).
- Executive Council meeting scheduled in Tanzania of the Afro-Asian Peoples Solidarity Organization (AAPSO) (Communist).
- 16th Pugwash Conference on Science and World Affairs opens in Sopot, Poland.

OCT

- 1 Soviet Red Army enters Yugoslavia under agreement with Tito providing for withdrawal on conclusion of military operations. (Only instance in East Europe where USSR honors such an agreement.) 1944.
