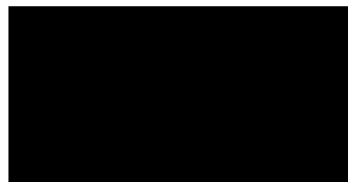
 OGC - January - April 1971


