Dear Mr. Hunter:

We have sent to you by separate first-class mail, three (3) prints of SK-241, Cornerstone Inscription and SK-242 Full Size Letters.

Your attention is directed to a variation from your letter of May 19, 1959, in that the Builder's names are shown on one line. We have found during preliminary studies that this variation allows a more symmetrical form to the inscription as a whole.

The letters in the line "Central Intelligence Agency" will have to be reduced in width to obtain a more suitable spacing for that particular line, or a proportionate reduction of height of the inscription in general will accomplish the same.

Upon receipt of your comments, we will proceed with the full size drawings.
