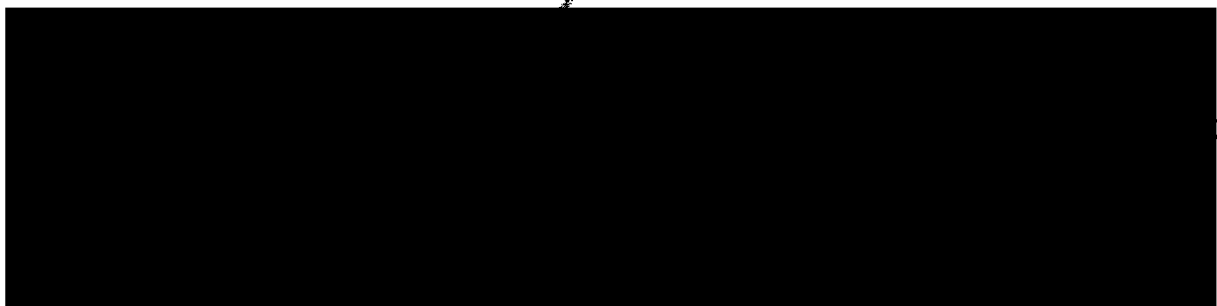
SUBJECT : Foreign Residence Restrictions

1. This memorandum contains a recommendation submitted for DDCI approval. Such recommendation is contained in paragraph 2.

2. In August of 1956 a proposed regulation, [redacted] "Foreign Residence Restrictions," was submitted to the Deputy Director (Plans), the Deputy Director (Intelligence), and the Inspector General for coordination. You will recall that, as a result of a case where an Agency employee resigned and remained overseas contrary to the wishes of the Agency, it was decided to consider having all employees going overseas execute a Foreign Residence Agreement. The idea was that the Foreign Residence Agreement would contain language to the effect that the employee would agree in advance of going to an overseas post that, in the event of resignation, he would not remain in the area without the approval and sanction of the Agency.

3. In the course of developing this proposed regulation and in considering the type of agreement that would be executed, it was recognized that even though an employee signed an agreement containing provisions precluding his remaining in or returning to the area in which he worked, it would not be legally enforceable. It was also recognized that in many instances imposition of such a restriction would be resented by some of our contract personnel and quite possibly preclude hiring certain desirable employees in the future.
