**Requirements for Real Estate and Construction Personnel
for Support Mission in Europe and NEA**

I. WAREHOUSING FACILITIES

a. For general information relative plans for establishment of the subject support mission, the following warehousing facilities are presently available:

b. This office is not presently constructing any additional facilities nor has no knowledge of any plans or proposals for construction of additional facilities in the future.

II. CURRENT OPERATIONS

a. Evaluation of current operations discloses that real estate and construction activities is primarily acquiring real property. The greatest need for real estate support is in the [REDACTED]. This is due to the size of the operation and the fact that practically all real estate requirements in the future will have to be fulfilled on the [REDACTED] economy. It is apparent that construction requirements can be supported with temporary assignments of personnel from Headquarters.

III. HOT WAR OPERATIONS

Pursuant to a discussion with Planning Staff/OL, it is understood that plans for hot war operations are not available at this time. Accordingly, this office finds that it is impossible to formulate requirements for support of hot war operations. Such requirements will be presented when plans for hot war operations are available and evaluated relative to support for real estate and construction.

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
