25 YEAR RE-REVIEW

1. The Agency has nominated nine employees for the Symposium on Cost-Effectiveness Analysis (14 - 16 June) sponsored by the Institute for Defense Analysis. Among the candidates are Messrs. John M. Clarke, [redacted]

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The purpose of this annual listing is to give the science and technical-type employees an up-dating opportunity. Of the information used, we were on target with the University of Michigan listing. Of a total of  students,  will attend Michigan. This is probably the result of glowing reports submitted last year by OSI employees on the quality of instruction at Michigan. I am surprised we received only one request for MIT (from OSI). However, we have received no training requests from the Office of Communications which is the usual user of MIT. Approximately 35% of the listed programs will be attended. This is something the Registrar can be proud of. However, one seventh of the programs attended are additions and four out of nine schools were not listed. We hope to ensure that future listings are more comprehensive.
