1. Evaluation of DDP Speakers

At the request of Mr. FitzGerald we are in the process of compiling a list of DDP speakers who have spoken outside the Agency during CY 1966 with an evaluation, where possible, of their performance. The report will be submitted this week [REDACTED]

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2. Special Briefing for White House Aide

On 20 December in the office of [REDACTED] of the Intelligence School briefed Mr. Everett Bumgardner a member of Robert Komer's staff. The briefing was in regard to the Vietnam Orientation program.

Mr. Bumgardner, who will visit the Honolulu AID training center, is conducting a survey of training being given personnel being assigned to Saigon by CIA and other agencies. By late January, Mr. Bumgardner is to submit a report on the desirability and feasibility of providing centrally coordinated training for all personnel -- State, Defense, CIA, etc. -- assigned to the newly established Office of Civil Operations under Deputy Ambassador William Porter in Saigon. course, tentative, approval for the idea and the companion suggestion of detailing a few persons to assist in its implementation.

3. Proposed North Vietnam Course

25X1A [REDACTED] C/FE/[REDACTED], has asked that a course be established 25X1A on North Vietnam covering such items as leadership problems, society, culture, etc. [REDACTED] who is firm in his interest, states that the course is to be for selected case officers; that FE will pay for whatever the course may cost, but expects OTR to arrange the details. Before making a commitment, we are checking our resources as well as investigating an on-going course at the State Department which might meet [REDACTED] requirements. 25X1A

4. The Training Selection Board

The Training Selection Board met on 22 December. The Board approved four candidates, one from each Directorate, to be Agency nominees for the 1967-68 NIPA awards. Also approved were candidates for the January 1967 running of the Mid-Career Executive Development Course.

5. Training Enrollments

Mr. Arthur Lundahl has applied for the IBM course, "Data Processing for Intelligence Community Executives," held in Poughkeepsie, N. Y. Spaces are hard to obtain and are by invitation only, but Lundahl's chances for admission are good.

25X1A [REDACTED] Office of Personnel, has been nominated for the three-week CSC Planning, Programming, Budgeting Course which will begin on

9 January in Charlottesville, Va. He will fill the one space allotted to CIA.
