

Possible Courses of Action:

- Make no significant changes in CIA training procedures.
- Use only presently available off-the-shelf foreign language Program Assistance to Instruction (PAI) courses, or with minor modifications to adjust these to our requirements.
- 3. In addition to #2 above, use only off-theshelf PAI courses which can be used to
 meet other CIA course needs; i.e., supervision, management, typing, shorthand,
 English usage, logistics, budget & fiscal,
 etc.
- t. Contract out for the development, testing and validation of foreign language PAI courses for which there is a large student requirement and for which no suitable off-the-shelf programs are available.
- 5. Same as above for Intelligence and Support Schools courses.

- 6. Develop an in-house capability to write, test and validate PAI courses as described in #4 and #5 above, with or without outside consultant advice and direction.
- 7. Proceed with Operations School courses along lines of paragraphs 4, 5, and 6.
- 8. Upon completion of educational systems

 analysis of all OTR schools, adopt recommendations for improvement of instruction,
 short of PAI; i.e., equipment replacement,
 greater use of audio-visual display techniques,
 management reorganization, etc.
- Conduct a systems analysis of non-OTE Agency training as directed by Executive Director-Comptroller and proceed as #8.
- a feasibility study on the use of Computer

 Assisted Instruction (CAI) to meet CIA training

 and educational requirements together with

 approximate costs for same.
