As you probably know, for the past two years we have been making revolutionary changes in the academic programs of the Industrial College. These changes have resulted from our continuing efforts to make the Resident Course responsive to the future-assignment needs of the highly motivated and already successful senior officers and top civilian officials who constitute the student body.
