Declass Review by NIMA/DOD

1. The disposition of the last remaining item on the contractor submitted residual inventory list, the [redacted] Clean Room Complex, was previously discussed in the referenced memorandum and at the contractor's plant on 10 May 1966. NPIC can now make a recommendation on this matter.

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2. Inquiry has been made of [redacted] EMIRC, of the Rome Air Development Center, Griffiss AFB, New York, who is presently planning a clean-room complex, as to their possible use of this clean-room at [redacted] or another location. Their reply was that they want their clean-room in the GAFB area, and the cost of dismantling, shipping, and erection of the [redacted] complex would be greater than building a new one. Inquiry was then made of [redacted] DESPA, Army Map Service, Washington, D.C. A reply similar to the first was received. Additionally, the AMS system is being planned as a laminar flow system and not as a clean-room per se. [redacted]

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[redacted] AFRDR-G (Air Force Requirements), was also approached as to the Air Force needs and possible on-site use of the existing facility at [redacted]. His reply, after numerous queries by him of possible users, also resulted in a negative answer. [redacted] [redacted] also gave a similar response.

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3. Since this existing complex is not being used as originally intended and is occupying nearly 4000 square feet of the contractor's plant, it is evident that the government, in the very near future, will be asked to pick up its maintenance, upkeep, and space-occupied costs. Additionally, as discussed at the 10 May 1966 meeting, the question of disposition of the clean-room is also detaining the disposal of the other equipments previously declared surplus (the HPA-5 Processor and the AFB-4 Film Drier).

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4. It is therefore recommended that this [redacted] Clean Room Complex be declared surplus and that the [redacted] be asked to submit a bid for all such surplus items, or that they be otherwise disposed of at the least cost to the Government.

1. It is requested that items 2 through 6 on referenced attachment "A" be shipped to the [Redacted] for delivery to NPIC, Attention: PADS/EDLS. Items 7 through 11 should be declared surplus and disposed of through normal channels. The GFE items (HTA-5 Processor and AED-4 Drier) are also surplus and should be disposed of in like manner.

2. The remaining item, the [Redacted] Clean Room Complex, needs further discussion regarding disposition. Contractually, if disposed of prior to June 1966 the Government is required to pay 80% of the restoration costs, 50% between June 1966 and December 1966, 25% between December 1966 and June 1967, and none after June 1967. It is recommended a solution be worked out between your office and the contractor as to disposition with the least cost to the Government, keeping in mind also, that the clean room complex is occupying approximately 3200 square feet of useable floor space, which the contractor is entitled to charge the Government for the use of, even if it is not presently being used. The contractor monitor, [Redacted] is planning to be at [Redacted] on 10 May 1966, at which time, pending your availability, this matter can be discussed.
