MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Development Branch, P&DS

SUBJECT: PAR 242, Color Demonstration Materials  
[redacted] has presented to me several arguments  
[redacted]s part concerning PAR 242.

1. "If NPIC had been more definitive in stating exactly what was required [redacted] could have done the job differently."

2. "The original study (PAR 213) is outdated, not complete and not good enough for briefing experts already working in color. (It is historical now; it only shows what work in certain areas has been done.)"

3. "[redacted] is not aware that they did a poor job; they duplicated according to their own standards and also printed what they thought NPIC wanted."

4. "If NPIC would have stood the expense, [redacted] would have printed five or six times as many items, then selected those few that would have been closest to the NPIC requirements."

5. "Any more work required by NPIC will cost additional funds since [redacted] considers the completed work to be satisfactory under the contract and according to their understanding of the requirement."

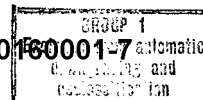
6. "The briefing material and the study (PAR 213) should be used only for general basic information and not presented as an [redacted] up-to-date study, (as stated in paragraph 2. above)!"

COMMENTS:

1. If we could get [redacted] to outline "their understanding" of the project, we may find some use for the material (although I doubt this).

2. [redacted] also leveled a charge that many of the old PARs under [redacted] were not up to NPIC expectations because so little effort had been made to hammer out the exact details of what was expected, all they [redacted] got was criticism. From now on all efforts would receive detailed agreements. He said [redacted] is not like [redacted] in which they played the major part in determining feasibility, etc. (It is interesting to note that NPIC long ago had pegged this problem area, but at that time [redacted] was reluctant to view [redacted] as being much different than [redacted] in-so-far as playing the leading role.)

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3. I don't believe we will gain anything but animosity if we attempt to make [ ] provide better materials at no further costs. It would also not be timely since there will probably now be little call for formal briefing of PAR 213. [ ] will stick by the people who made the materials. Even though I'm sure they see some places where they are culpable, they are not going to face [ ] with the charge.
