HISTORY AND ORGANIZATION OF NPIC

Background - unique capabilities of the photograph as an intell medium

Photo Intelligence Div, ORR, 1954

- Photo materials primarily from conventional Military Service collections
- PI from paper prints.
- No all-source collateral systems
- No major technical intell support
- No production processing equipment
- No file storage
- Photo materials from Special and conventional collection systems

MAutomat (ORR & OCR) 1956 (spring)

- Photo materials primarily from [redacted]
- PI from dup. pcs.
- Utilization of all-source collateral
- In-house photo reproduction support
- In-house photogrammetric support
- Military service representation (minus A/F)
- Beginning of film library
- Coding of PI info into machine retrieval systems
- Evolution in PI rpt. format

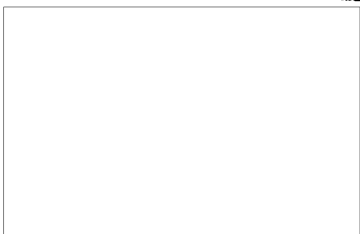
Photo Intell Center, DD/I, Aug 1958

- Photo materials primarily from Special collection systems with increased uses of conventional systems
- Target data handling by machine methods
- Beginning of joint procurement of equipment
- Joint participation by Military Services (minus A/F)
- Evolution in Immediate and MCI reporting

National PI Center, DD/I, 19 Jan 61 (NSCID #3)

- Utilization of all-source photo materials
- Integration of all Military Services in PI and Support

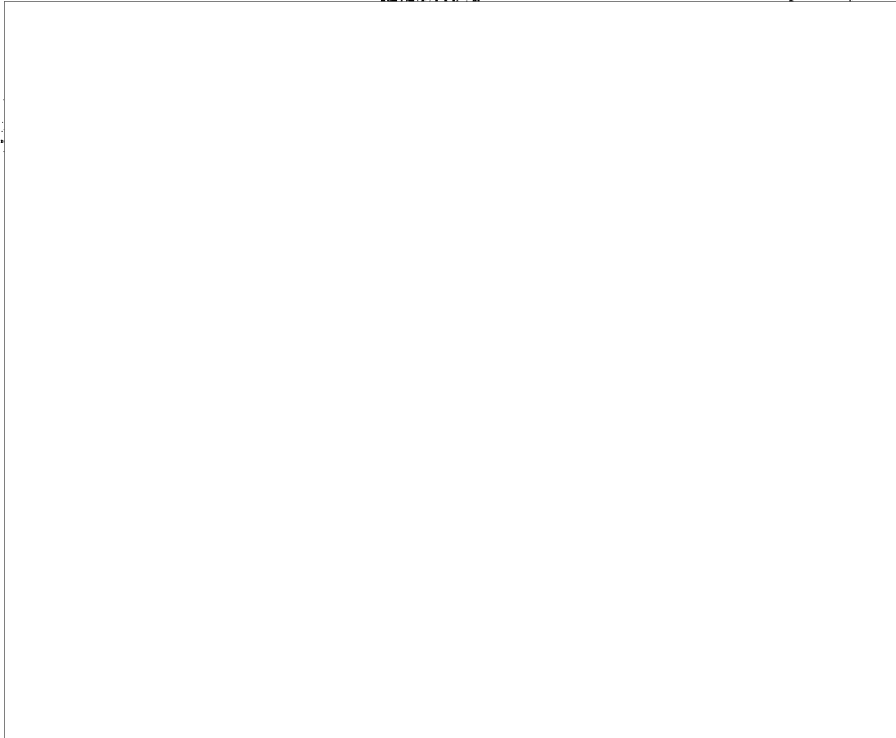

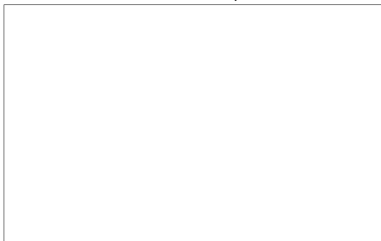
