MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Imagery Exploitation Group, NPIC

SUBJECT : ACDA Briefings

1. [redacted] of ACDA has requested that we give the following briefings to two groups of ACDA officers (a dozen or so each):

a. Photo-interpretation of strategic targets (meaning strategic weapons systems -- offensive and defensive).

- [redacted] requests that we devote about three hours to this group, including about two hours on offensive and one hour on defensive.

- He asks that we show the group how we go about PI work on such targets, the visible details of the systems -- silos, silo doors, security gates and fences, power houses, antenna, etc., etc., and, illustrate many of these details with appropriate models as well as photos.

b. Photo-interpretation of tactical forces, installation and equipment.

- Ditto above.

2. [redacted] requests that we present the "strategic targets" briefing as soon as we can. When can you be ready? (Answer Monday, 1 June.)

3. The "tactical forces" briefing can be later -- name a leisurely date when you can be ready.

4. Those ACDA officers of these two groups who have not had a general orientation briefing on NPIC and photo reconnaissance will receive same from me prior to your getting them for the above briefing.

5. I am in touch with Director, OSR, on the question of whether or not OSR and other officers from Langl [redacted] list in any discussions that develop.

If there are details to arrange, your staff can discuss them with [redacted]

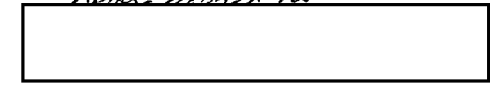

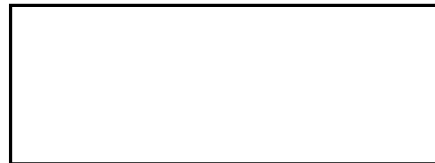

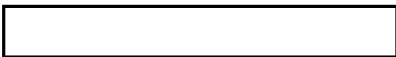
I feel much more confident, as a result of our visit, of being able to respond accurately to the questions that arise in the course of the Committee's work about our photographic surveillance capability.
