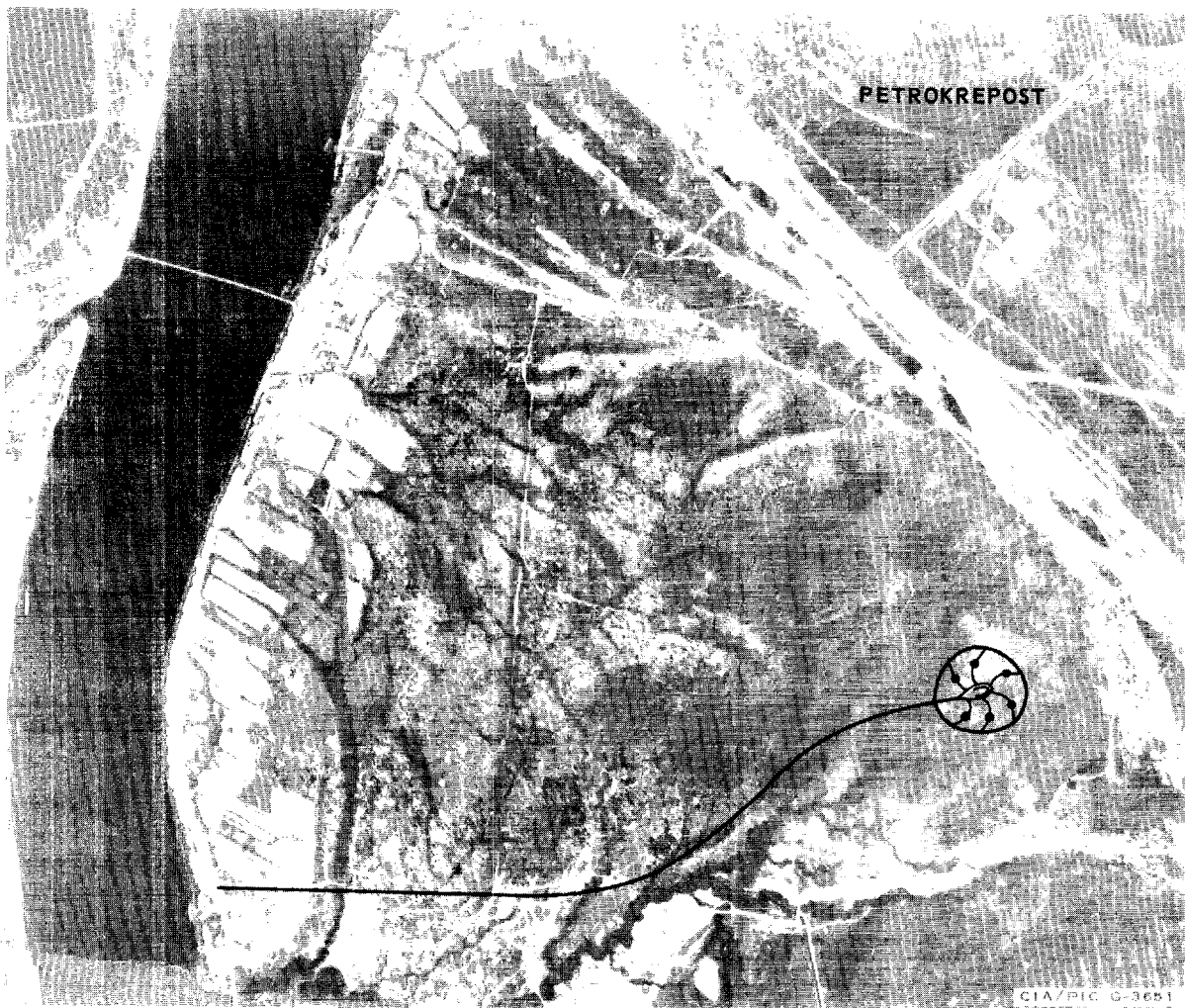


FIGURE 1. SAM SITE 22 NM E OF LENINGRAD, USSR. A small-format aerial photograph of [redacted] provided the first known photographic coverage of this SAM site, whose location is overprinted in red on this [redacted] photograph.

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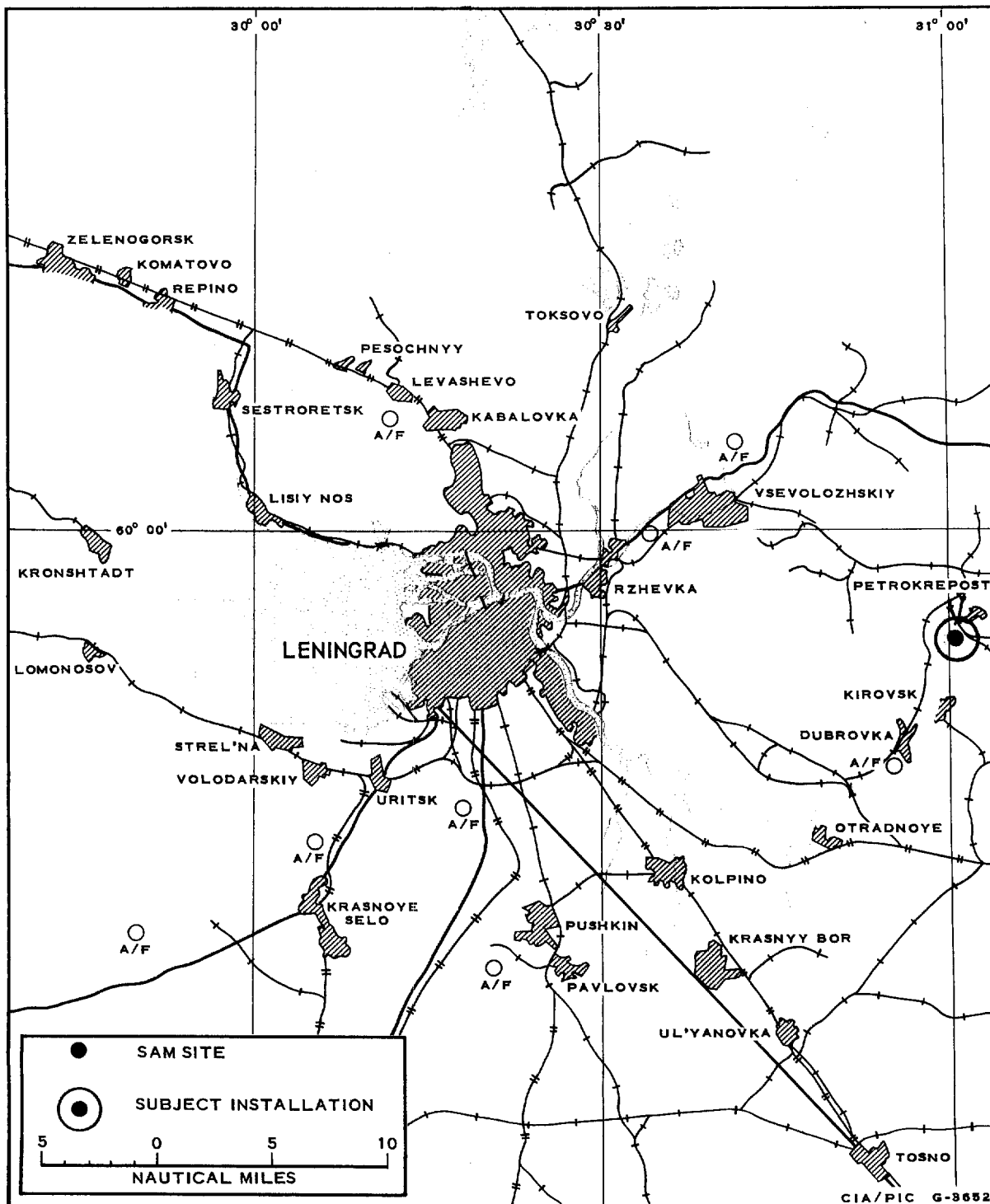


FIGURE 2. SAM SITE NEAR LENINGRAD, USSR. Date of information, [REDACTED]

LOCATION:

22 nm east of reference point.

FUNCTION:

A site deployed for the defense of Leningrad.

SITE STATUS:

Possibly complete and operational.

REMARKS:

This is the first known photographic coverage of an SA-2 SAM site near Leningrad.

Although the single small-format aerial photograph is of extremely poor quality, service roads are visible which indicate that the site has six launch revetments and one large guidance revetment.

The site is situated on level terrain in a generally cleared area.
