

(TSR) The ACRV M-1974 (variant) is similar to the ACRV M-1974, which is associated with self-propelled artillery, except for two distinctive features. The variant has no turret	
and may have a rectangular extension which overhangs the right rear edge of the chassis. Three ACRV M-1974 (variants) at Uralsk have the rectangular extension and one of these also has an erected antenna mast (Figure 2A).	25 <b>X</b> 1
(S/WNINTEL) The identification of the ACRV M-1974 (variants) at Uralsk Army Barracks, a probable communications school, suggests that the ACRV M-1974 (variants) have a probable signal command role. This school usually contains equipment only associated with signal units.	
(TSR) A new, unidentified probable tracked vehicle (canvas covered) was also seen at Uralsk Army Barracks on photography The vehicle has a probable circular antenna forward and an unidentified, possibly circular object aft.
