MEMORANDUM FOR: Inspector General

Don:

1. I believe the following should be called to your attention for what further study or action seems appropriate.

2. On 11 August 1975, Mr. Ben Evans advised Mr. Al Rodriguez that, in the process of cleaning out some papers in an old EXDIR collection, he had come across a "Gallup Poll". He told Rod he wasn't aware of any particular sensitivity, but would forward it over to Rod for possible use in the Center for the Study of Intelligence.

3. Rod reported this matter to me on 4 September 1975, and I told him to get it to me immediately. I have been doing some quiet research on the matter in order to get a better understanding as to what we really have, and I furnish you the following information. It would appear that both in 1964 and 1966 the Agency. [redacted]

[redacted] had a contract with a Gallup organization to run a survey concerning "The Public's Knowledge of the Central Intelligence Agency".

4. I have attached for your review an Office of Security write-up on what we know [redacted] and also a copy of the 1964 and 1966 report of the Gallup organization.

5. I still have traces out as to how the survey of 1964 was paid for. I have ascertained, however, the procedure used to pay for the 1966 survey, information attached, and also attached is correspondence between Colonel L. K. White and the [redacted]. Also attached is some other information which appears to particularly pertain to the 1964 transaction.


