Meeting on 11 May re Army project "Theory and Practice of Communist Subversion"

1. On the Agenda was the allocation of work for the above named project. Working level agreement on the outline had been reached previously by representatives of State, Army and CIA.

25X1A2d 2. Mr. Hawkins first pointed out that any agreement reached by this meeting would have to remain subject to Mr. Evans' approval. He then asked whether the meeting should proceed and allocate work in view of the fact that the [redacted] Committee would be legalized in about ten days and that the project in question would presumably fall under that Committee's jurisdiction. [redacted] pointed out that too much time had passed already, that Army was anxious to have the paper soon - the original deadline being 1 July - and that the meeting should go ahead and allocate the work with the understanding that approval be given by Mr. Evans and, later on, if necessary, by the [redacted] Committee.

3. It was decided to follow the latter course. After a slight modification of the outline, suggested by Mr. Marcuse of State, agreement was reached on the allocation as indicated in the attached chart. The first of August was agreed upon as a deadline for the completion of the draft paper, with the understanding that the deadline may have to be extended. While State may not be able to begin the work until the middle of May, CIA will begin immediately.

4. The atmosphere was one of mutual understanding and cooperation and the outcome is considered by the International Communism Group as gratifying.
