PLAN FOR INTELLIGENCE TREATMENT OF

INTERNATIONAL COMPONIEM BY CIA

I. Assumptions:

- 1. That international Communism constitutes a primary, current, and long-range threat to US national security.
- 2. That the aims and objectives of international Communism are to a large degree indistinguishable from those of the USSE.
- J. That US policy and operational agencies require a greater volume of better intelligence than has been produced on this subject in order to wage effective political, aconomic, psychological and other kinds of warfare against the USSS and the international Communist movement.
- h. That adequate intelligence treatment of international Communism requires coverage of the subject on a threefold basis: namely, (a) from the vacompoint of the USSR, (b) as it relates to the individual country concerned, and (c) its total international effect on US security.
- 5. That a full scale analysis of the organisation, dectrine, functions and methods of operations, personalities, objectives and capabilities of the international Communist movement on a continuing basis, country by country, and world-wide, is essential to US security. It is not sufficient from an intelligence viewpoint merely to "Cover" trends and developments as they everys.

II. <u>Organisational Plan</u>

- 1. The proposed plan provides for three elements to be established within OPE for the intelligence treatment of international Communism as follows:
 - a. The ORE Intelligence Production sound, under the chairmanship of the Assistant Director, ORE, and augmented by selected experts in the study of the Communist sovement will give overall guidance and direction to the production effort, and will review and approve rafts of reports produced prior to publication.
 - b. The International Communism Group, ER/USER Franch, under the operational direction of the Chief, RE/USER Branch, will have primary production responsibilities for intelligence coverage of international Communism on a world-wide basis.

- c. The Regional Branch Communism Beak, under the functional guidance of the Chief, International Communism Group, EE/USSR Branch, and under the administrative control of the regional branch chief will be responsible (1) for coordinating and integrating regional and national analysis of the Communist movement in the area concerned, (2) for coordinating this effort with the International Communist Group, EE/USSR Branch, and (3) for keeping the respective Regional Branch Chiefs informed of world-wide Communist activities which apply to their areas.
- 2. The composition of each of these elements is set forth below:
 - a. The ORE Intelligence Production Board augmented by:
 - (1) Representative, OIR, Dept. of State
 - (2) Representative, FBI
 - (3) Representative, 050
 - (4) Chief, International Communism Group, RE/USSR Branch
 - (8) Representatives of the other IAC agencies whenever matters pertaining to their interests are under consideration.
 - b. The International Communism Group, EE/USER Branch

 - (E) Such additional analysis as the branch concerned may elect to assign to such duties

III. Mission

- l. Under the overall guidance of the IPB, (augmented) the operational direction of the Chief, EM/USSE Branch, and in collaboration with the other ORE producing components, the International Communist Group, EE/USSE Branch will produce national intelligence on international Communism which will:
 - a. analyse the dectrine, organization, techniques, personalities, and activities of the international Communist movement as an instrument of Soviet foreign policy and as a threat to US security.
 - b. determine its immediate and long-range aims and objectives in all areas, individually on a country by country basis, and collectively on a world-wide basis.
 - e. appraise its capabilities in meeting such objectives, interpret the significance of its activities in terms of US security and forecast and interpret its probable future activities and their consequences.
