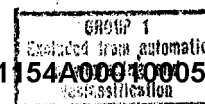

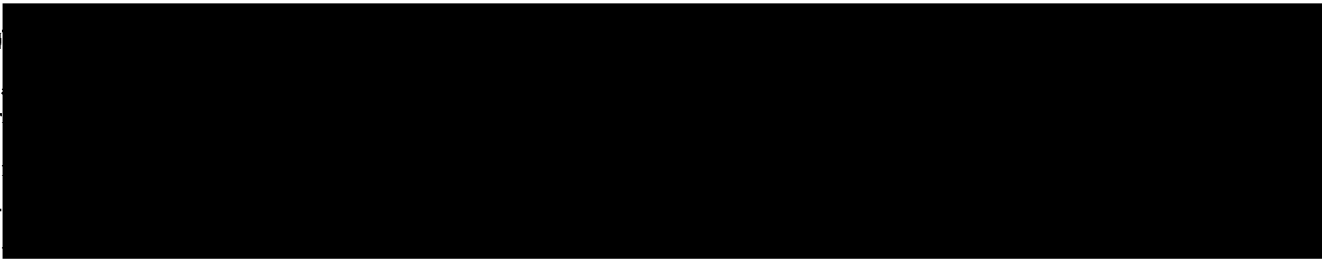
Publications
