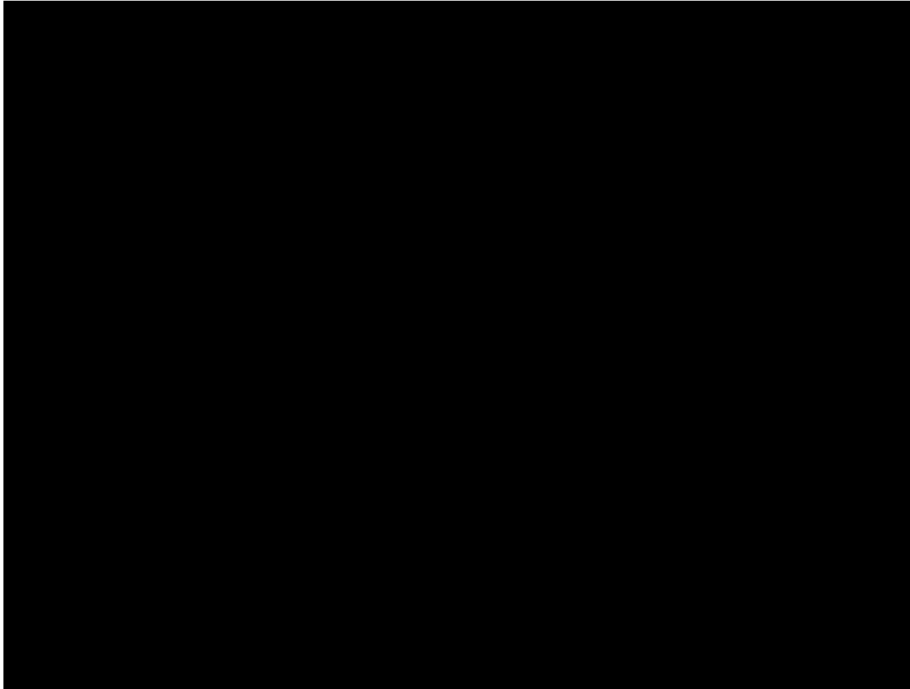

CIA Cafeteria Q Building

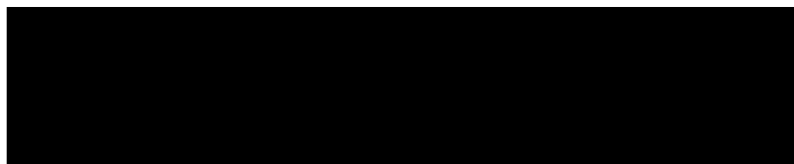
