Haitian Kidnapping

The three terrorists and 12 released prisoners involved in the abduction of the U.S. Ambassador to Haiti departed Mexico for Chile on 1 February 1973. In addition to paying for the 15 airline tickets, the Mexican Government gave each individual 200 dollars and furnished them with new clothing and other personal items.

Of the nineteen individuals whose release from prison was demanded by Ambassador Knox's abductors but was denied by the Haitian Government, one was a Communist and had studied in the Bloc; eight were possibly identical with individuals involved in the Haitian Communist movement; two had traveled to Bloc nations; and two were possibly identical with individuals who had visited Bloc nations. One was dead and there was no identifiable information on the remaining individuals.

Syrian Responsibility for Letter Bombs Addressed to U.S. Officials

Israeli security services, investigating a Syrian-operated spy network in the occupied Golan Heights, claim they have established that Syrian intelligence agents had carried across the cease-fire line the letter bombs addressed to President Nixon, Secretary of State Rogers and Secretary of Defense Laird that the Israelis intercepted in October 1972. Members of the ring mailed the letters on 24 October in Qiryat Shemona, a town two miles from the Lebanese border. Members of the same network have also admitted sending letter bombs to Israelis inside Israel.

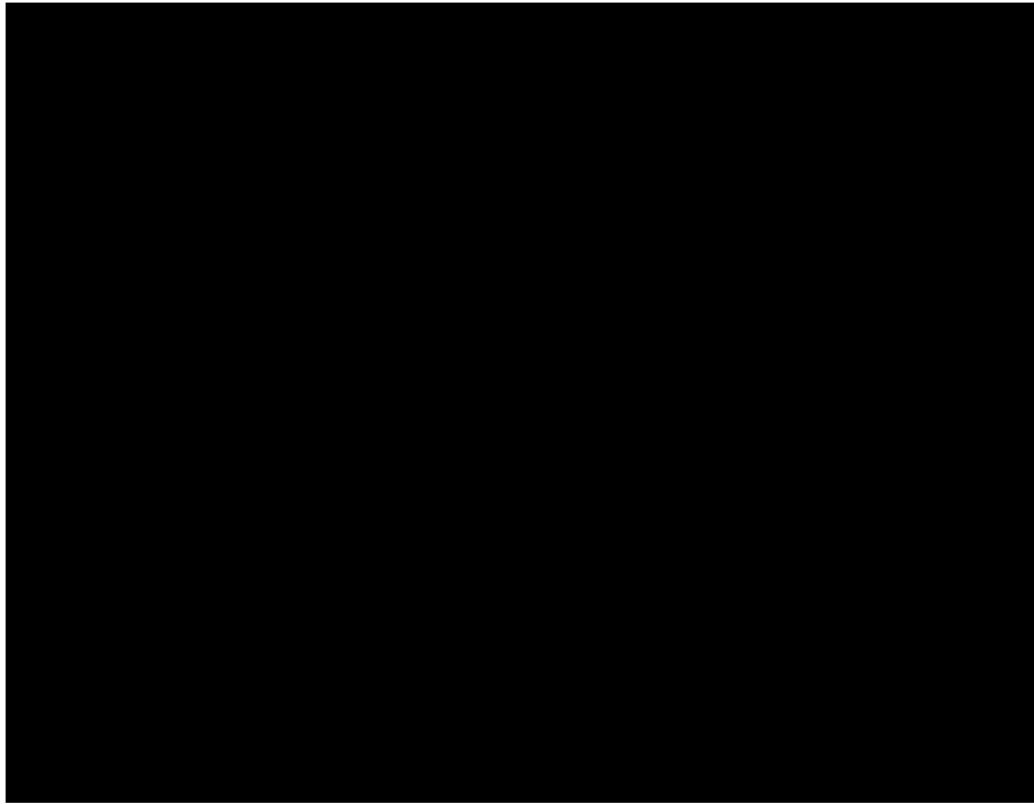
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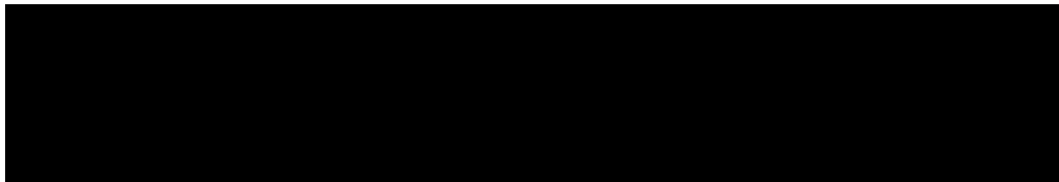
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Terrorists Convicted for Bombing of French Consulate in Spain

On 1 February 1973 a military tribunal in Zaragoza, Spain, sentenced five Spanish students, members of the "Collective of the Hammer and Sickle," to 30 years' imprisonment for their part in the November 1972 bombing of the French Consulate in Zaragoza which resulted in the death of the Honorary French Consul. 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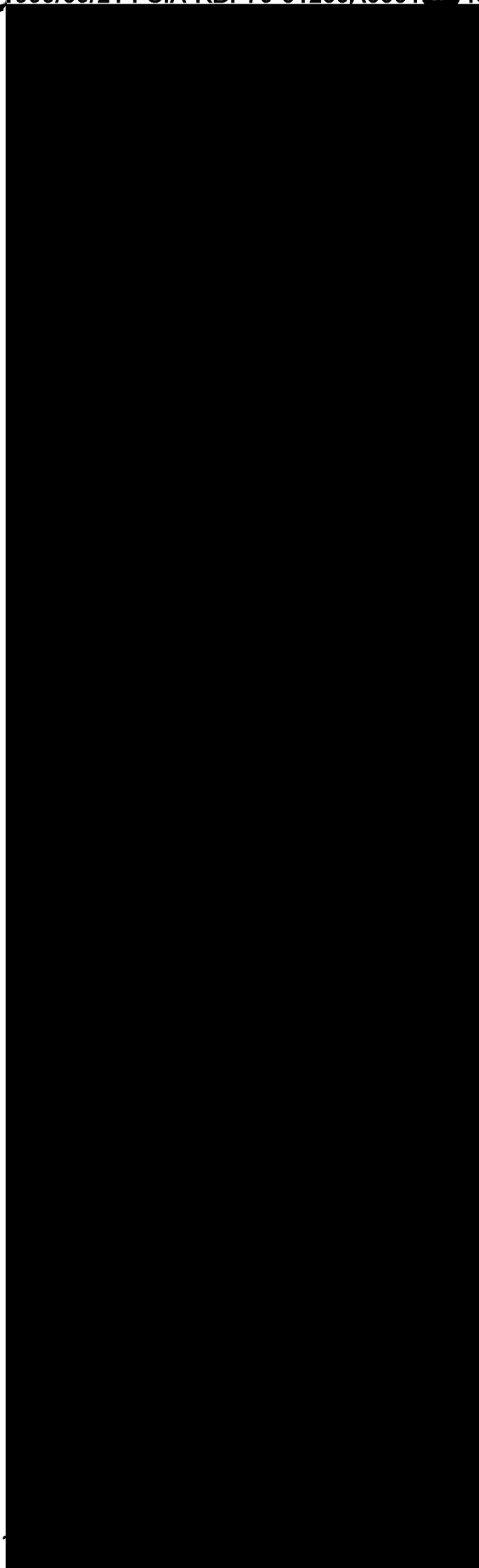

Police reported that postal security workers intercepted two more letter bombs, which bore Turkish stamps and postmarks. A total of 11 letter

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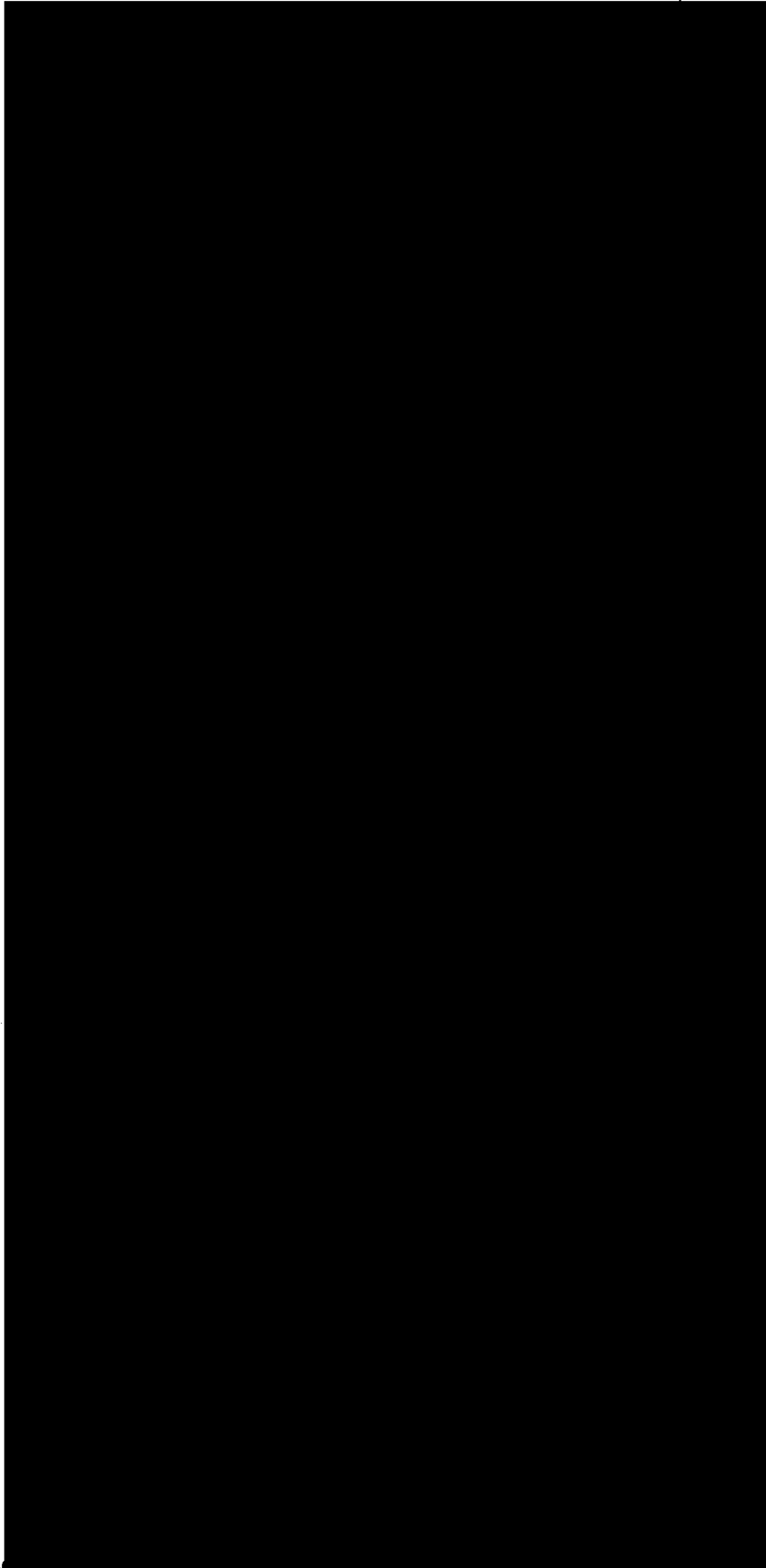
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bombs were thus discovered

mantled without incident.
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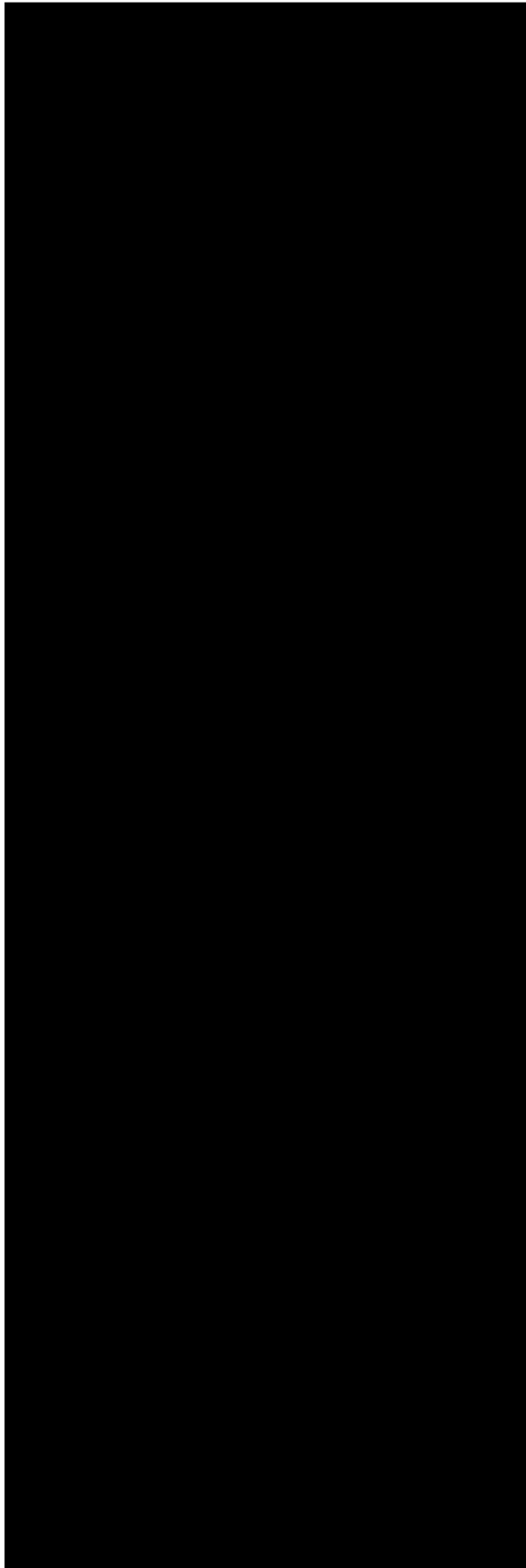

Italy

Postal authorities reported detection of the third mail bomb in six days addressed to screen actresses. The bomb caught fire at the Pisa railway station as the bag that contained it was being loaded into a mail truck. No reasons were given for the mailings. (UNCLASSIFIED)

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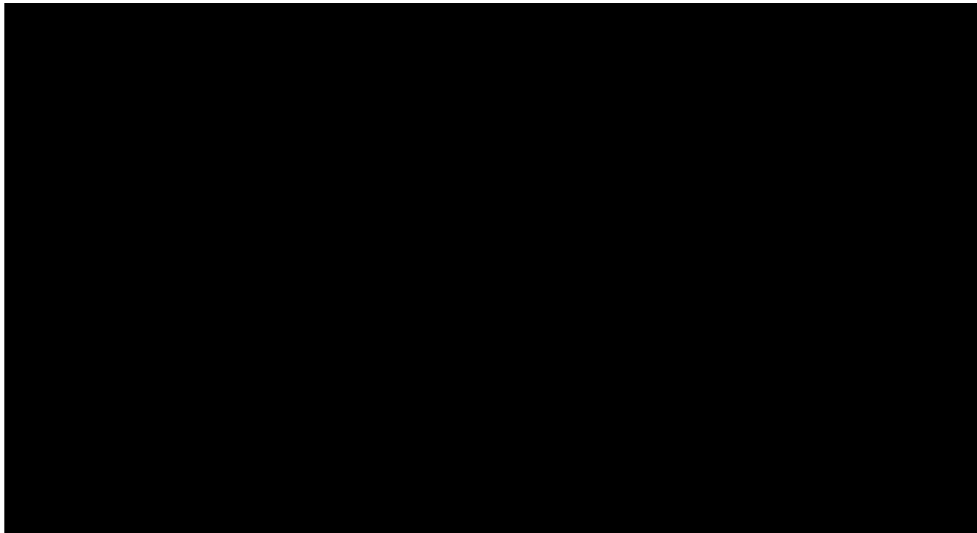
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Charges Against Meir Kahane and Others for
Attempt to Smuggle Arms Out of Israel

On 6 February 1973 Rabbi Meir Kahane, head of the Jewish Defense League (JDL), and three other persons were formally charged in a Tel Aviv court with attempting to smuggle arms out of Israel. The arms--a submachine gun, a pistol, ammunition and hand grenades--were found in September 1972, packed in a crate for shipment in the air freight department of Israel's El Al airline. JDL members previously had told a press conference they wanted to send arms abroad for counter-terrorist activities against Arab diplomats and institutions in the United States and Europe, following the murder of members of the Israeli Olympic team in Munich. Kahane is presently free on bail on previous charges arising from letters sent by the JDL to Israeli Arabs proposing that they emigrate. (UNCLASSIFIED)



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Jordanian Republican Army Claims Responsibility
for Blowing Up Saudi Arabian Tapline

In a letter published by the Lebanese newspaper Al-Muharrier on 8 February, the self-styled Jordanian Republican Army Al-'Iqab forces reported one of its units blew up the pipeline in Saudi Arabia in the latter part of January because it is an "artery for the imperialist war machine against the world's revolutionary forces and the Arab nation." The letter further stated that the Jordanian Republican Army forces have carried out a number of operations against the Jordanian regime without making announcements about them. (Comment: There is no identifiable information on the Jordanian Republican Army and it is not known if the organization has any connection with fedayeen organizations.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

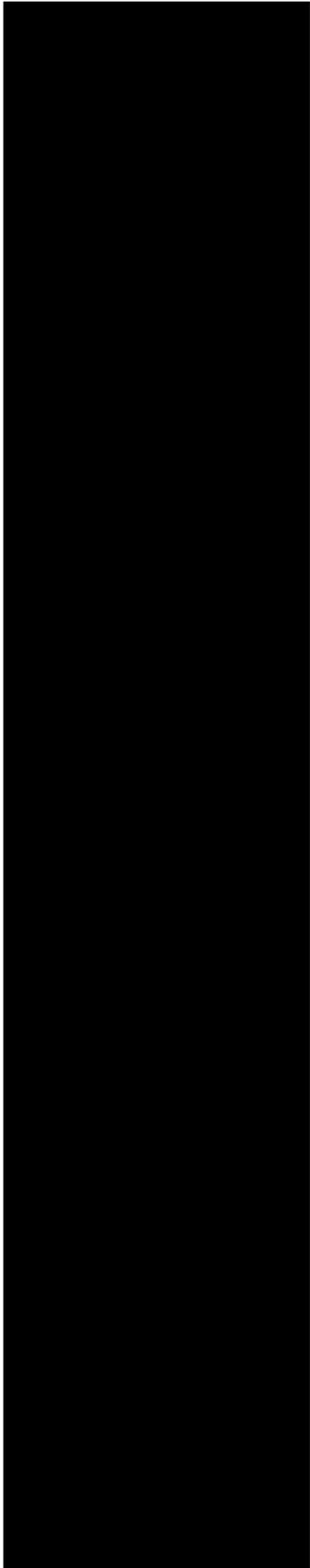

Santiago, Chile

A Braniff International DC-9 airliner, with 137 persons aboard, bound for New York returned to Santiago ten minutes after departure as a result of an anonymous telephone call that a bomb had been placed aboard the plane. Police searched the plane but failed to find a bomb. (UNCLASSIFIED)

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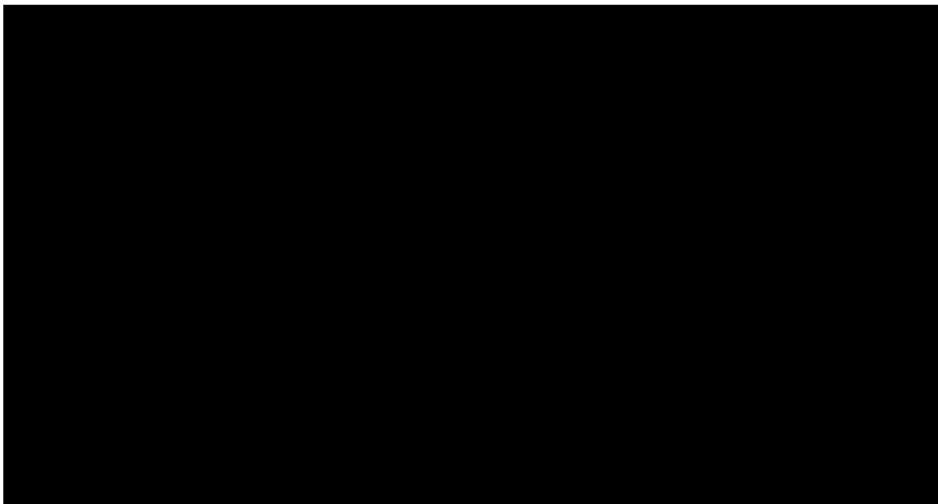
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Escape of Aircraft Bombers from Italy

In mid-February 1973 two Arabs accused of planting a booby-trapped tape recorder on an El Al plane in August 1972 were released on bail in Rome. The Arabs were accused of persuading two English women to take the tape recorder on board the Rome-Tel Aviv flight. The bomb exploded in midair but caused only minor damage, and the plane returned safely to Rome. On 20 February the Italian press reported that the two terrorists had fled on a ferry to Yugoslavia. The Italian authorities had kept the Arabs' passports, but had placed no other restrictions on their provisional liberty status. (UNCLASSIFIED)

13 February 1973	Athens, Greece	A Lufthansa jetliner which was the object of a bomb alert after it had taken off from Beirut landed safely in Athens. A police search of the passenger sections failed to turn up a bomb. (UNCLASSIFIED)
13 February 1973	Jerusalem	Israeli police report that arsonists tried to burn down a Christian missionary printing office but the fire fizzled out before causing serious damage. It was the second attempt to burn Christian missionary buildings in a week. A week earlier arsonists set fire to the International Center for the Holy Scriptures, damaging dozens of books and old manuscripts.

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A police spokesman said that officials suspected members of the militant Jewish Defense League (JDL) and that four JDL members were held after the first incident.

London, United Kingdom

Three masked gunmen attacked the Indian High Commission (Embassy) and held staff members hostage, in an as yet unexplained attack. Switchboard operators were able to get a swift alarm out to Scotland Yard. British police battled their way into the building and shot two of the gunmen after they were threatened with imitation firearms. The third intruder, aged about 15, flourished a sword but was captured after a struggle. According to a High Commission spokesman, the three raiders, all young, burst in and began hitting Commission employees and tied several of the staff up. Three

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members of the High Commission were injured by the gunmen and taken to the hospital. The identities of the raiders have not been discovered; the three were described as Indian-looking but it was not immediately known if they were Indian or Pakistani. Scotland Yard sources said police were investigating the possibility that the men were Pakistanis protesting against India's continued detention of Pakistani prisoners of war. Police noted that Pakistanis have recently demonstrated in London and Manchester against India. Comment: A threat against Indian missions by Pakistani extremists was reported in the Weekly Situation Report on International Terrorism of 13 December 1972.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

20 February 1973	Malmö, Sweden	A bomb alert interrupted a concert by the Leningrad Philharmonic Orchestra. Following an anonymous telephone call claiming there was a bomb in the hall, the building was evacuated and searched. The call turned out to be a hoax. (UNCLASSIFIED)
20 February 1973	Berlin, West Germany	A bomb exploded in a public mailbox in the Neukölln District, causing no damage or injuries. In a compartment for mail to West Berlin addresses only, police found the remains of a package 15x11x4 cm., which had contained the bomb. The package consisted of aluminum sheet metal wrapped

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in cardboard and bound with cord, and bore no writing. Police have no suspects yet but are continuing the investigation. (UNCLASSIFIED)

A car owned by an American serviceman was destroyed and that of a second US military man was damaged by bombs presumably planted by opponents of the current Greek regime. There were no injuries. (UNCLASSIFIED)

An explosive device was thrown from an alley outside and detonated inside the U.S. Army Homburg Kaserne in Hanau. There were no injuries and property damage was limited to \$50. (UNCLASSIFIED)

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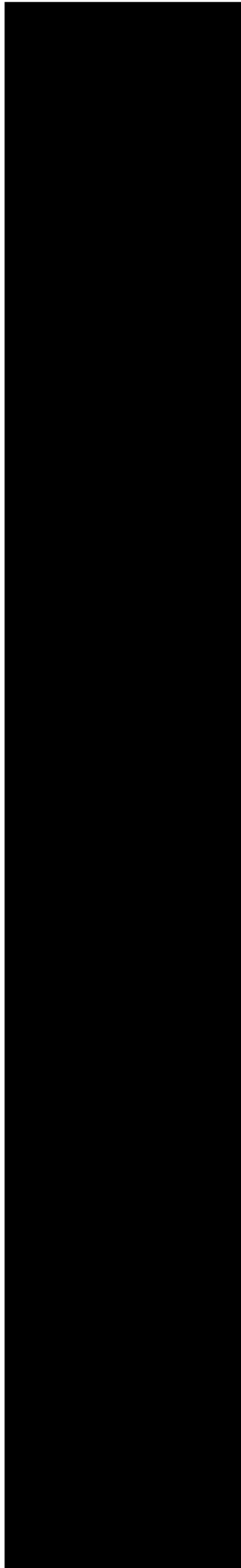

Rome, Italy

Two letter bombs addressed to a Cabinet minister and an Italian movie actress exploded, injuring the minister's secretary and the actress' sister. The secretary opened the letter and suffered burns on his right hand. The letter addressed to the actress blew up in her sister's face and caused slight burns. Several such letter bombs have been sent to Italian personalities recently.

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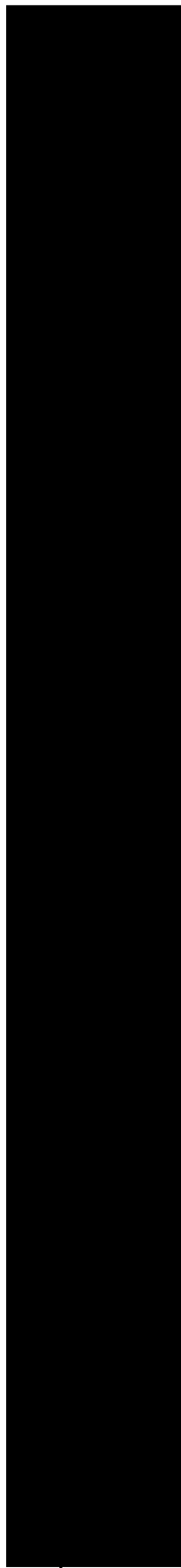

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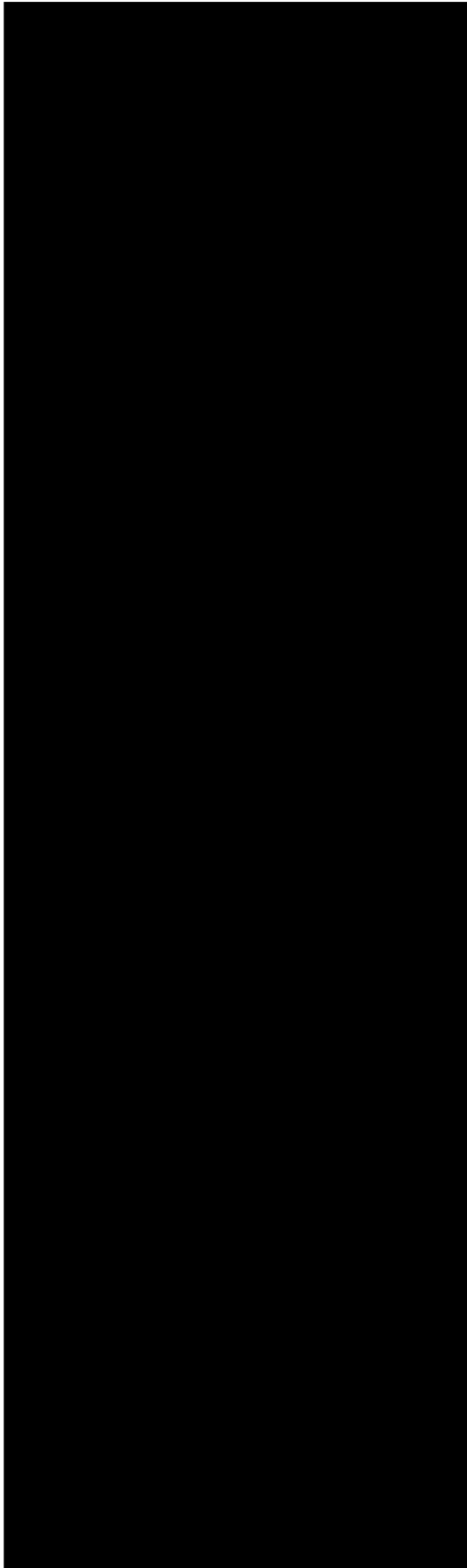

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
