There is no evidence that the hijacker was connected with any terrorist organization or group. Venezuelan security authorities are trying to determine how the hijacker was able to board the aircraft with a gun, and airport security measures have been tightened. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Soviet Security Police Kill Two Hijackers

Two young hijackers reportedly were killed on 1 November at Vnukovo airport, 20 miles south of Moscow, according to Reuters, after they and two companions had hijacked an Aeroflot airliner as it approached Moscow. The four young men, according to the unconfirmed reports, demanded one million dollars and safe passage to Stockholm in return for the release of one passenger and the aircraft navigator, both of whom were apparently wounded in the hijacking.

High-ranking Soviet officials were reported to have negotiated with the hijackers for five hours while Soviet police and security men maneuvered into positions from which they could open fire. The oldest of the hijackers, age 20, was killed when he opened the door of the plane. The identity of the men involved and their political or terrorist affiliation, if any, are not known. 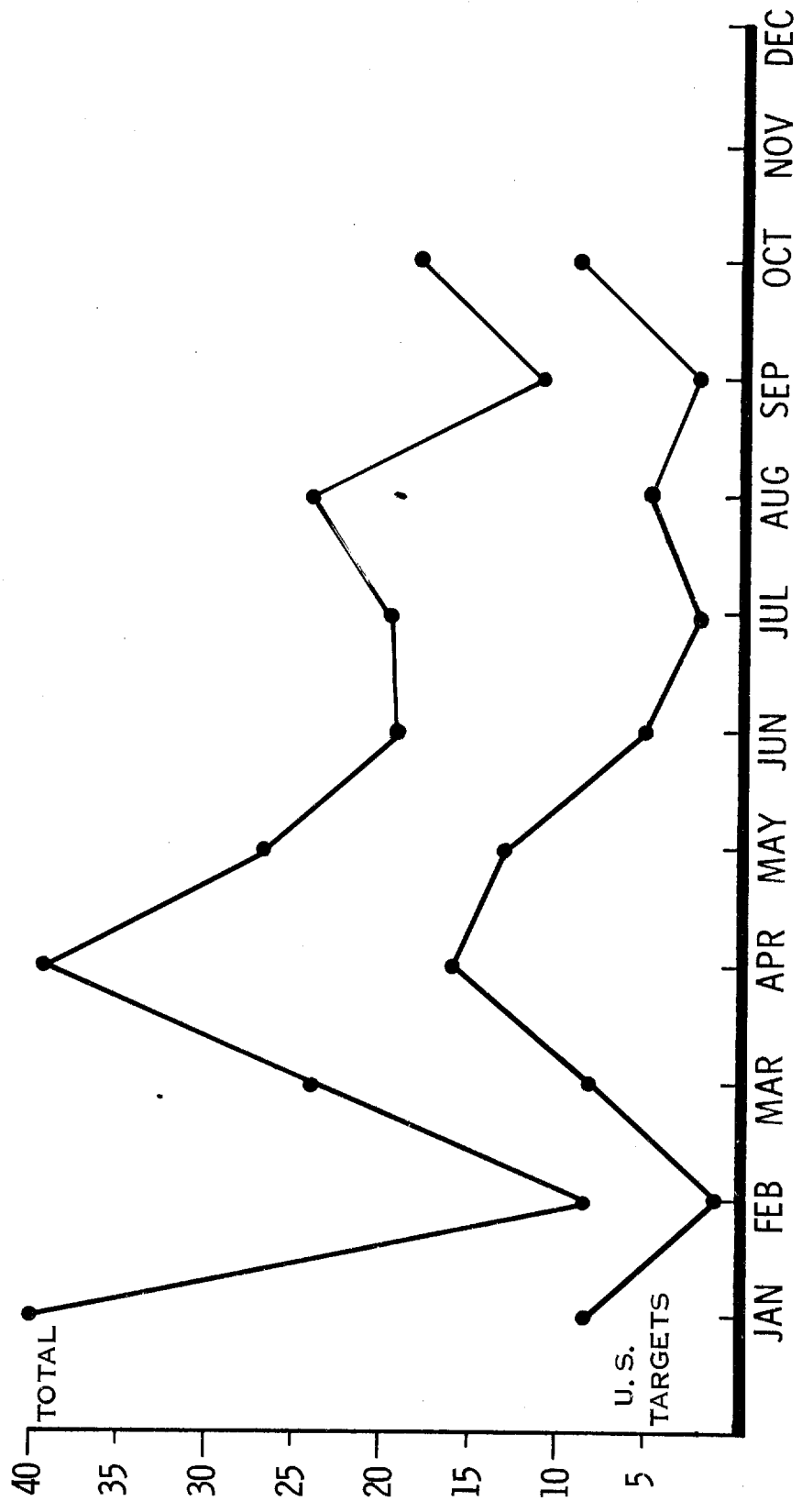

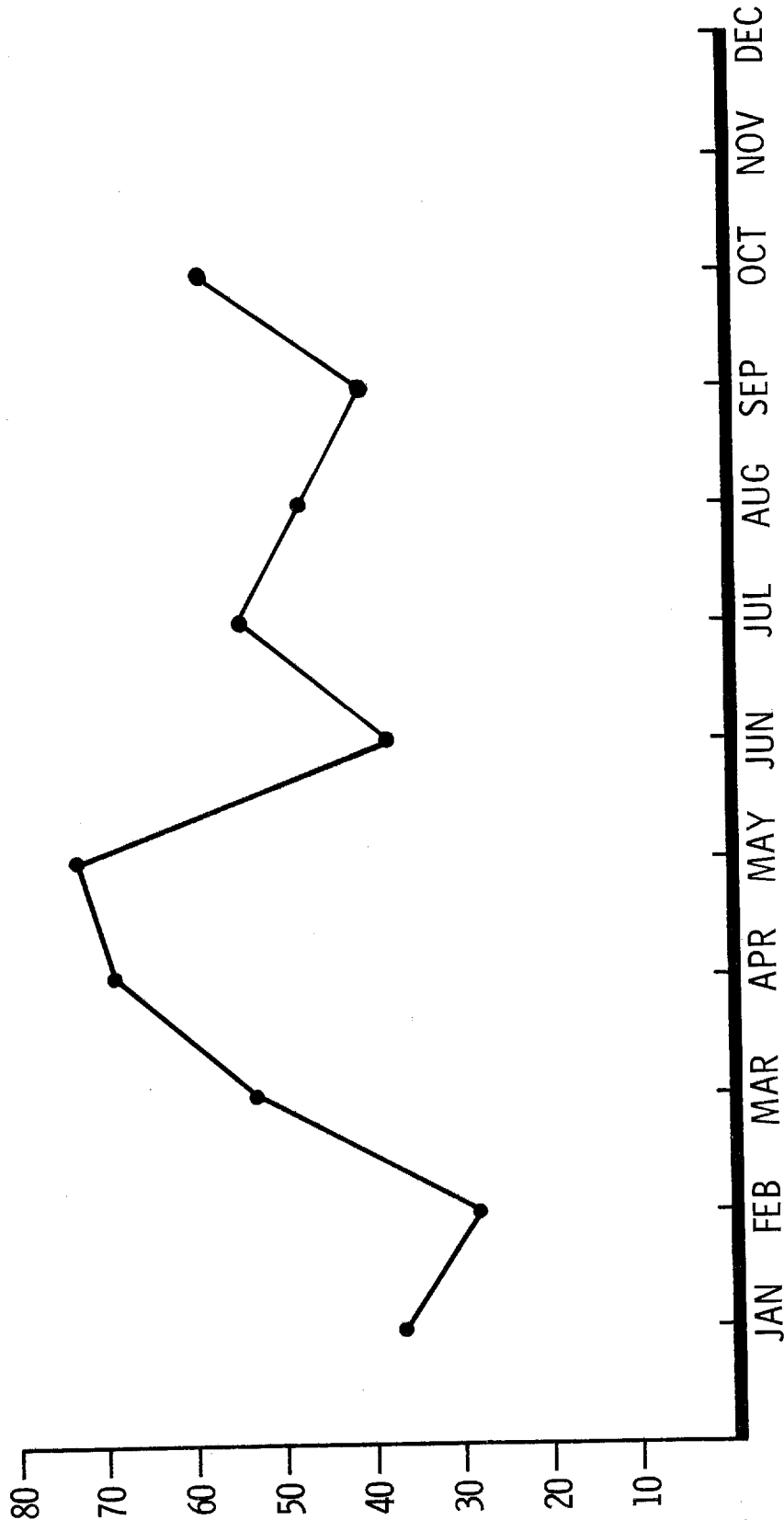

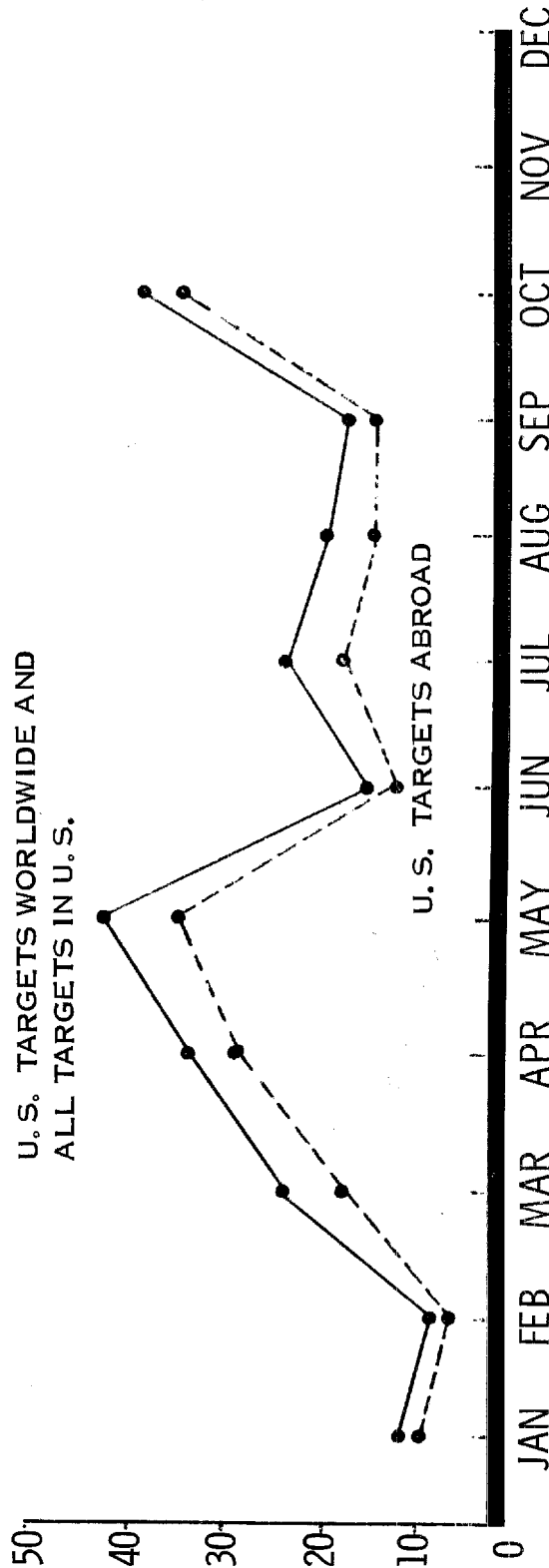

17 November 1973	West Germany, Nuernberg and West Berlin	Bomb attacks on ITT in West Germany. Two subsidiaries of ITT in West Germany were hit by bomb explosions on 17 November. One explosion occurred in the factory and offices of the U.S. firm Standard Electric Lorenz in Nuernberg. All windows in the four-story building were smashed and cars parked in the street were demolished. In the British sector of Berlin, a bomb exploded on the ground floor of a building where an ITT subsidiary is located. There were no injuries, but there was considerable damage to the building and adjacent structures. Several automobiles parked in the area were also damaged, but an incendiary device planted under one of the cars in front of the building failed to go off. The perpetrators of the two bombings are unknown, but German authorities advised the West German director of ITT that they did not rule out involvement of the German extremist Baader-Meinhof group in the bombings.
