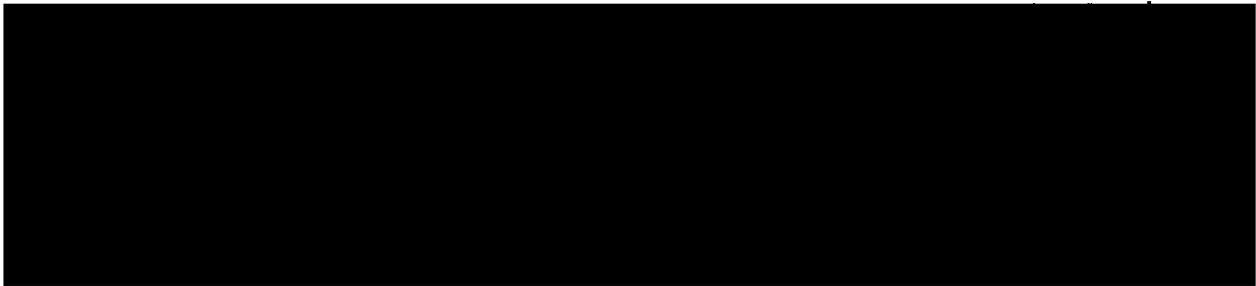

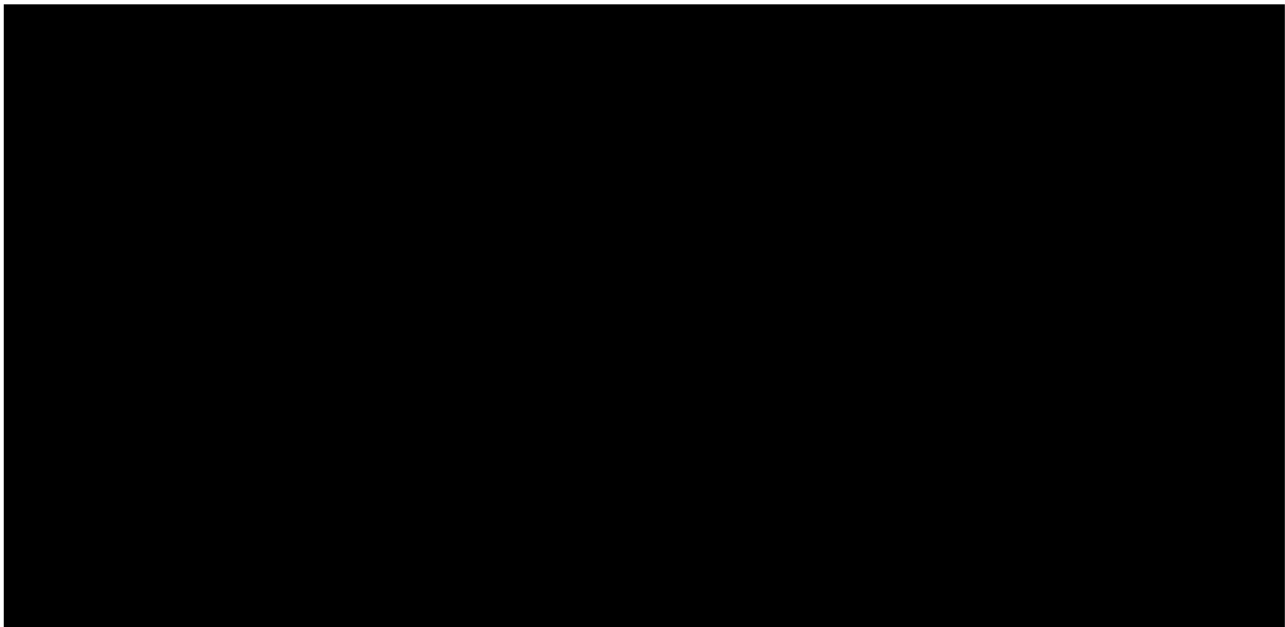

GARI Terrorists Arrested in France

Four members of the anti-Franco International Revolutionary Action Group (GARI)--two Spanish and two French--were arrested by French police the weekend of 21 September, according to the Spanish press. French, Belgian and Spanish security services believe the GARI is responsible for a series of terrorist incidents directed at Spanish personnel and installations in France and Belgium in May, July and August 1974. (See the issue of 21 August, page 4.) Press accounts said that the French Minister of Interior publicly described the GARI as "primarily a terrorist and criminal organization whose aim is to provoke in France and abroad sabotage and explosions to create a climate and atmosphere of terror and insecurity." (UNCLASSIFIED)



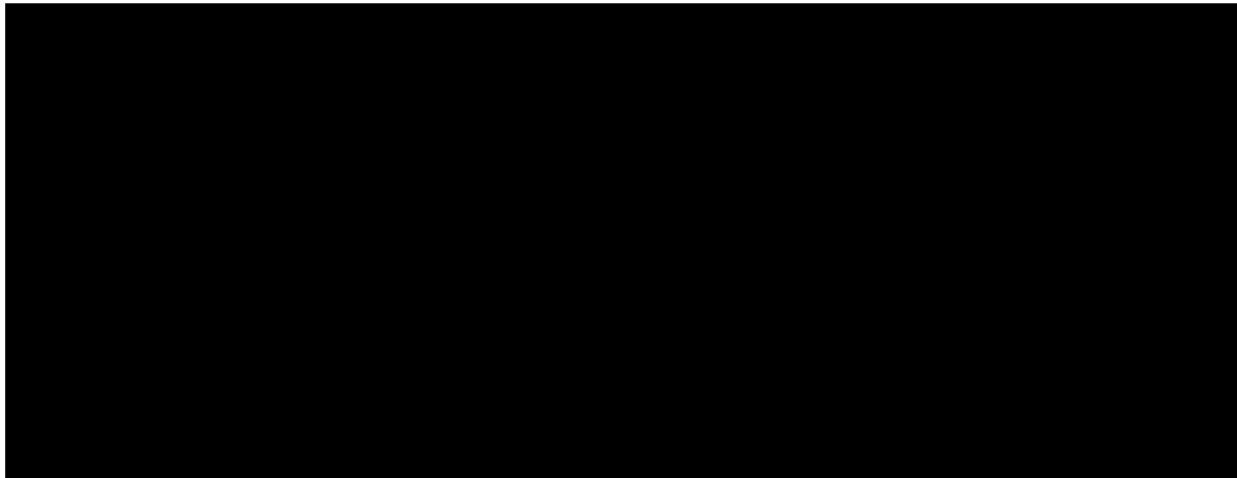

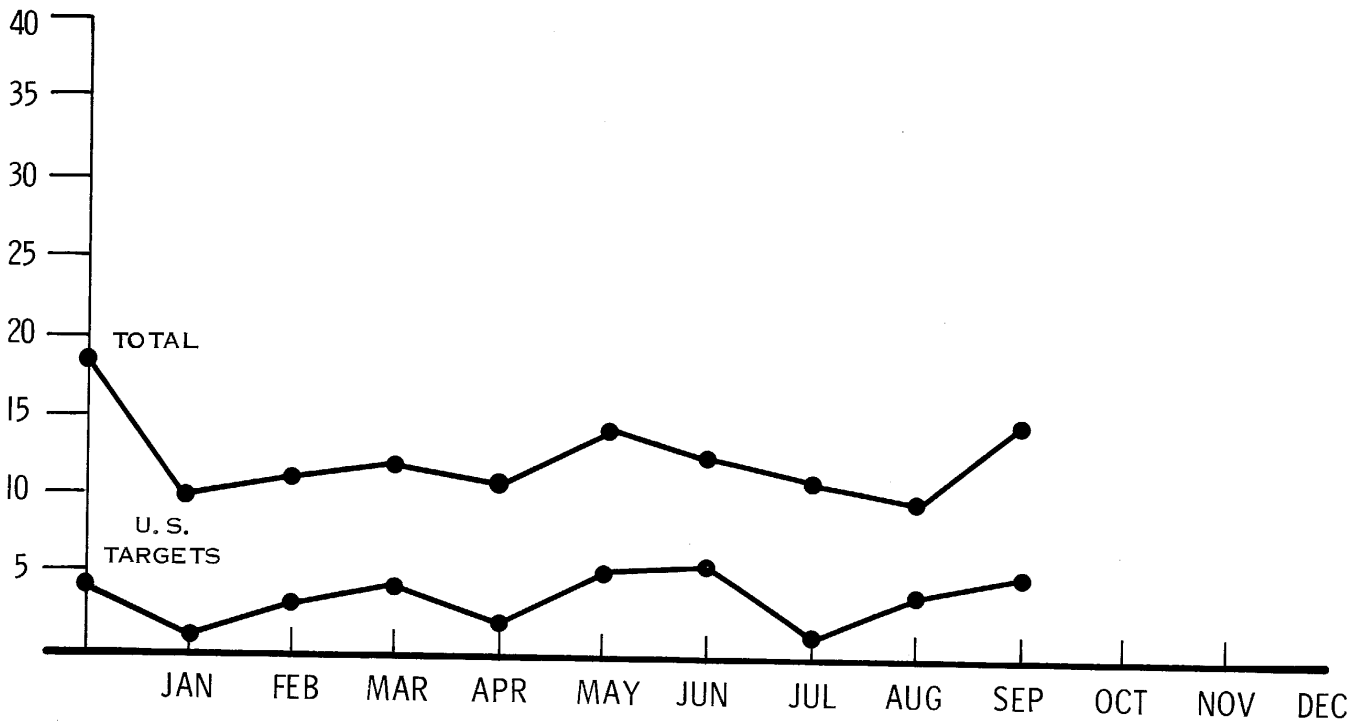

Baader-Meinhof Leaders Indicted in Death of Four Americans

The West German Federal Attorney returned an official indictment against the leaders of the West German anarchist-urban guerrilla group Baader-Meinhof (also known as the Red Army Faction) on 2 October, according to a Reuters dispatch of that date. Accused are the group's founders, Andreas Baader and Ulrike Meinhof, and three other hard-core members. The indictment charges them with having carried out the May 1972 bomb attacks which claimed the lives of four Americans. (Three American servicemen died in the attack against the U.S. Army's Headquarters in Heidelberg and another at the Fifth Corps Headquarters in Frankfurt.) The defendants have been in pretrial detention since the summer of 1972 when they were apprehended by West German police after a two-hour gun battle. The detention of the leaders has significantly crippled the group's activities. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Coca-Cola Official Freed in Argentina

On 8 October police freed Maurice Kember, an Anglo-Argentine business executive and president of Inti, Inc., a subsidiary of the Coca-Cola Bottling Company, who was kidnapped by guerrillas on 6 August. (See 14 August issue, Tab A.) He was freed after a gun battle in which one of his abductors was killed, two wounded and three others captured. A \$1.5 million ransom had been demanded for his release. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Joint Communique by Groups Rejecting Middle East Negotiations

The radical fedayeen organizations and the Ba'th party of Iraq issued a joint communique in Baghdad, dated 12 October, in which they reiterated their opposition to peace negotiations concerning Palestine. It was signed by leaders of the Ba'th party, the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP), the PFLP-General Command, the Arab Liberation Front, and the Popular Struggle Front. The communique condemned all formulas aimed at recognizing the Zionist entity and freezing the Palestinian conflict; denounced "deviationist trends aimed at liquidationist solutions;" agreed to creation of a united front of all organizations and personalities rejecting capitulation; condemned "imperialist plots," particularly Iran's

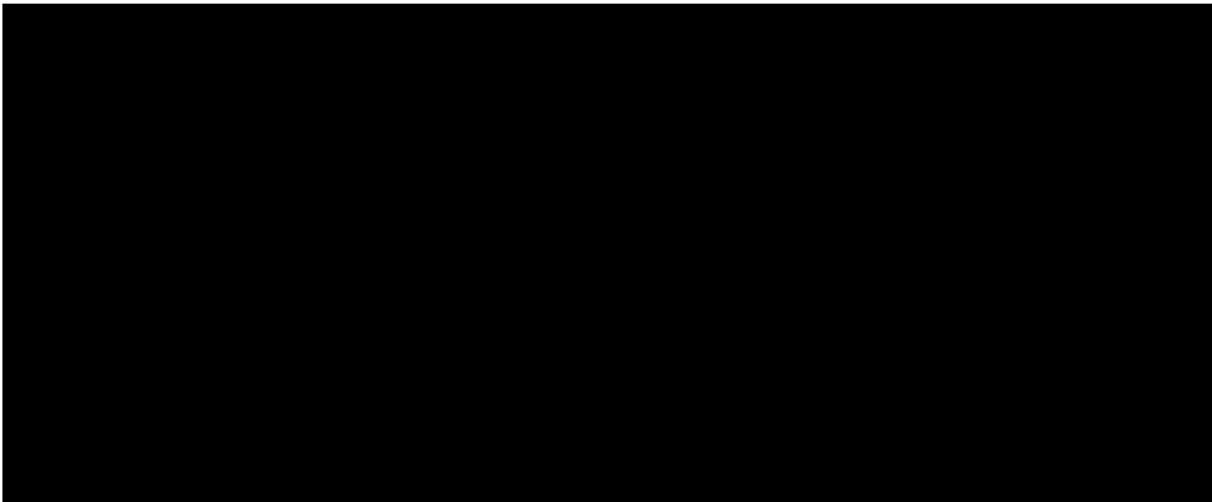

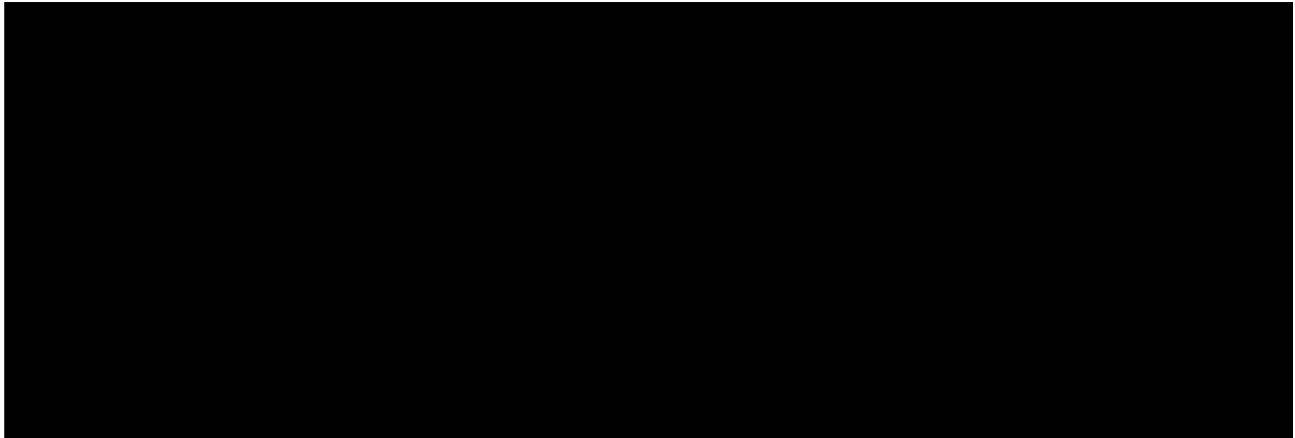

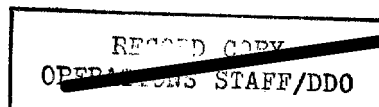

CHRONOLOGY OF SIGNIFICANT INTERNATIONAL TERRORIST ACTS

- Date: 21 October 1974 The USIS Binational Center and three affiliates of U.S. companies were targets of terrorist bombs. An explosion occurred at the USIS center in Rio Cuarto at about 4:00 a.m. Considerable damage was done, but no one was injured. An Argentine official of the Transax Company (a Ford affiliate) was seriously injured by a powerful bomb as he left his home in San Carlos. A Ford showroom and a Pepsi Cola bottling plant in Rio Cuarto were bombed, with moderate damage and no injuries. (UNCLASSIFIED)

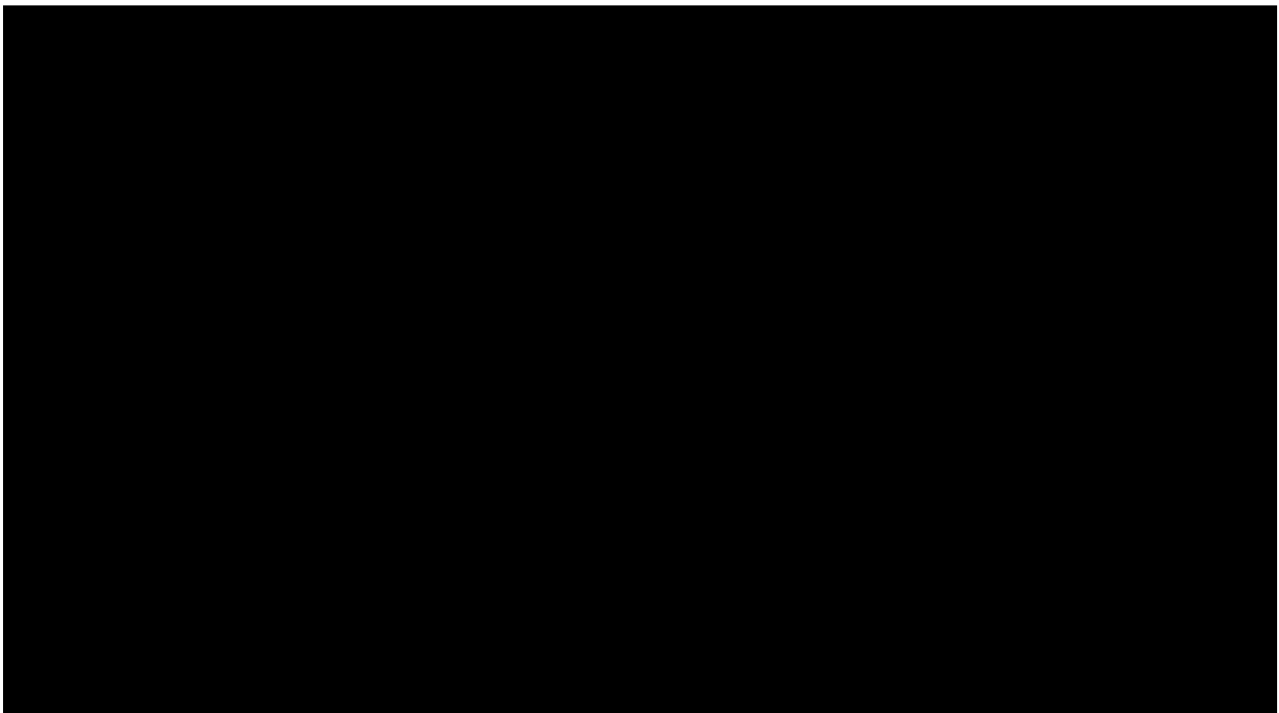

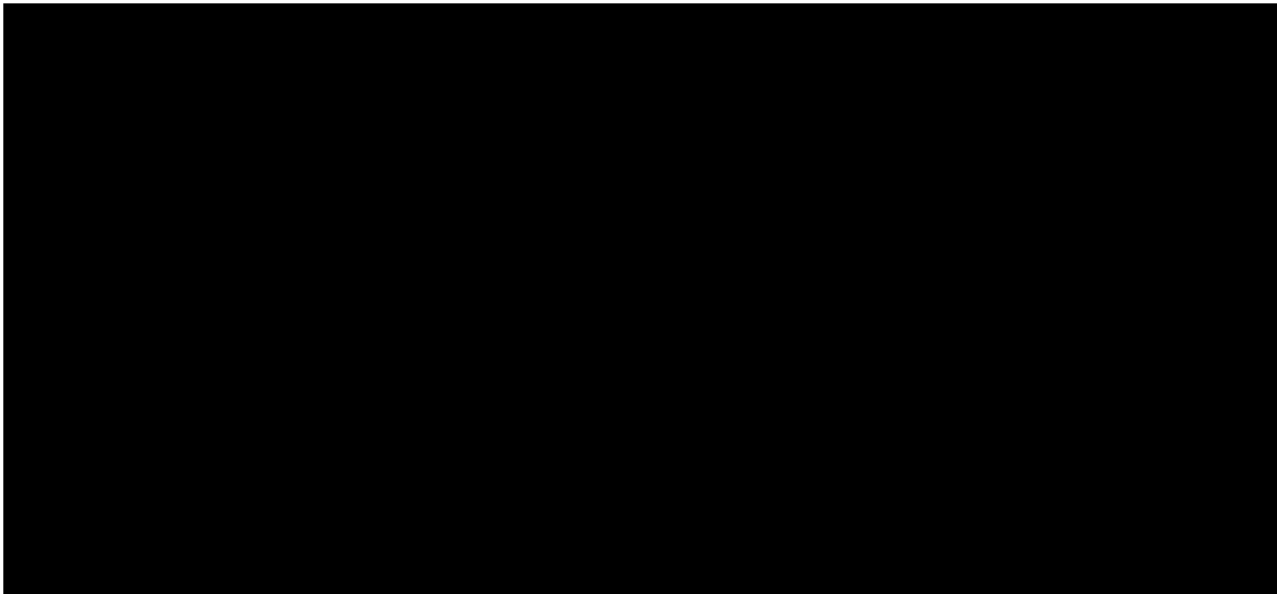

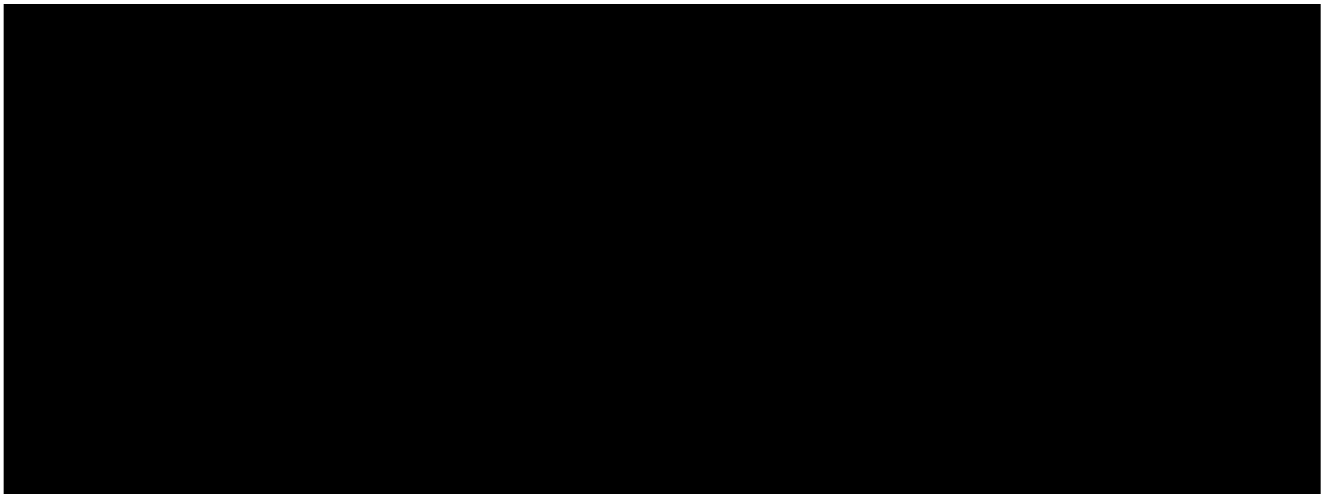
