Explosion Wounds Ustashi Terrorist in Germany

On 29 January Ljubomir Dragoja, a member of an Ustashi terrorist group based in Australia, was severely wounded in an explosion in Frankfurt, according to the Yugoslav press. ("Ustashi" is a name used by Croatian right-wing groups in exile.) Dragoja reportedly was traveling on a passport issued at the Yugoslav Embassy in Canberra and arrived in Germany in mid-1974. The press further reported that police found evidence, apparently in the debris, of the preparation of bombs to be sent through the mail. (UNCLASSIFIED)

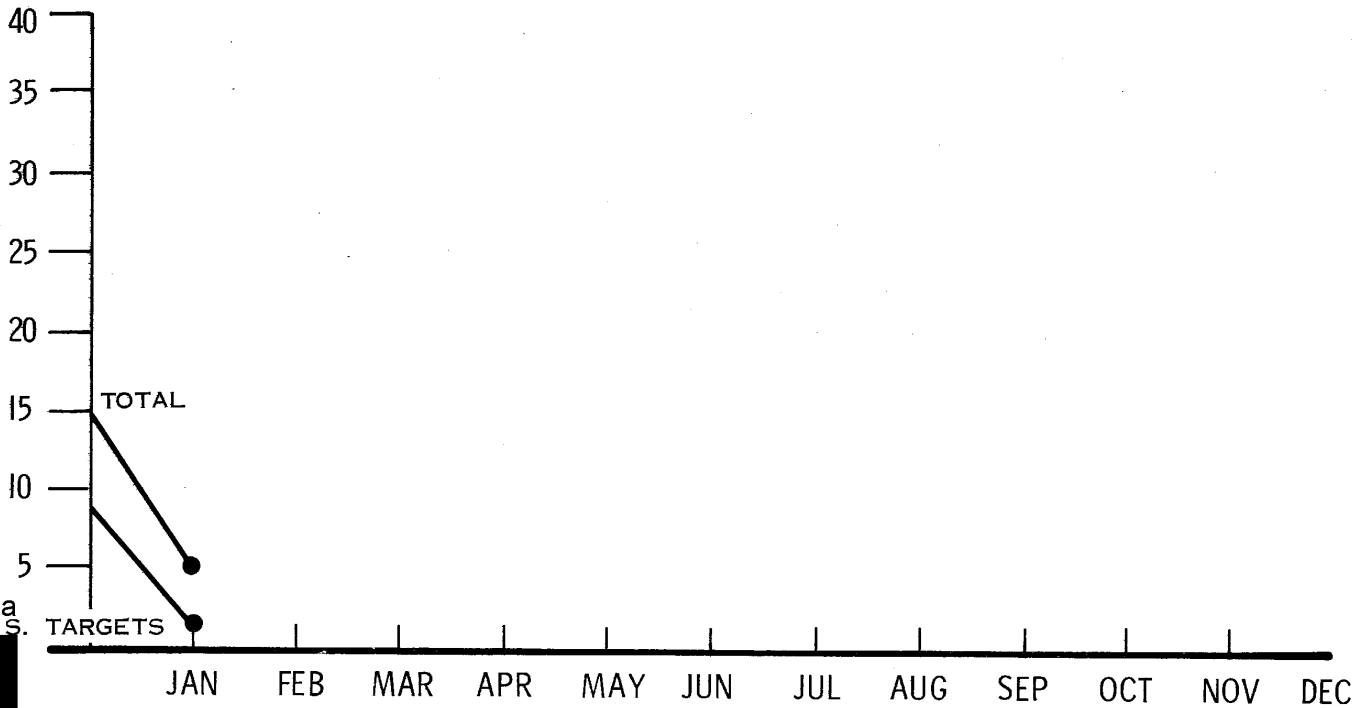

Date: 31 January 1975 Dutch Consul Kidnapped.  
Place: Colombia, Cali The Honorary Dutch Consul was kidnapped near his villa outside Cali, according to the Colombian police. Radio reports said the kidnapping was probably carried out by members of the Revolutionary Army of Colombia, a Moscow-leaning Communist guerrilla group. (See Articles.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

Date: 1 February 1975 Explosion at Venezuelan Consulate.  
Place: New York A home-made bomb packed in a plastic container exploded outside the Venezuelan Consulate General, causing moderate damage. Shortly after the blast, an unidentified Spanish-speaking male telephoned CBS TV and stated the bomb was placed by an anti-Castro group called "Omega 7." (See Notes.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

Hijacker to be Extradited to Colombia

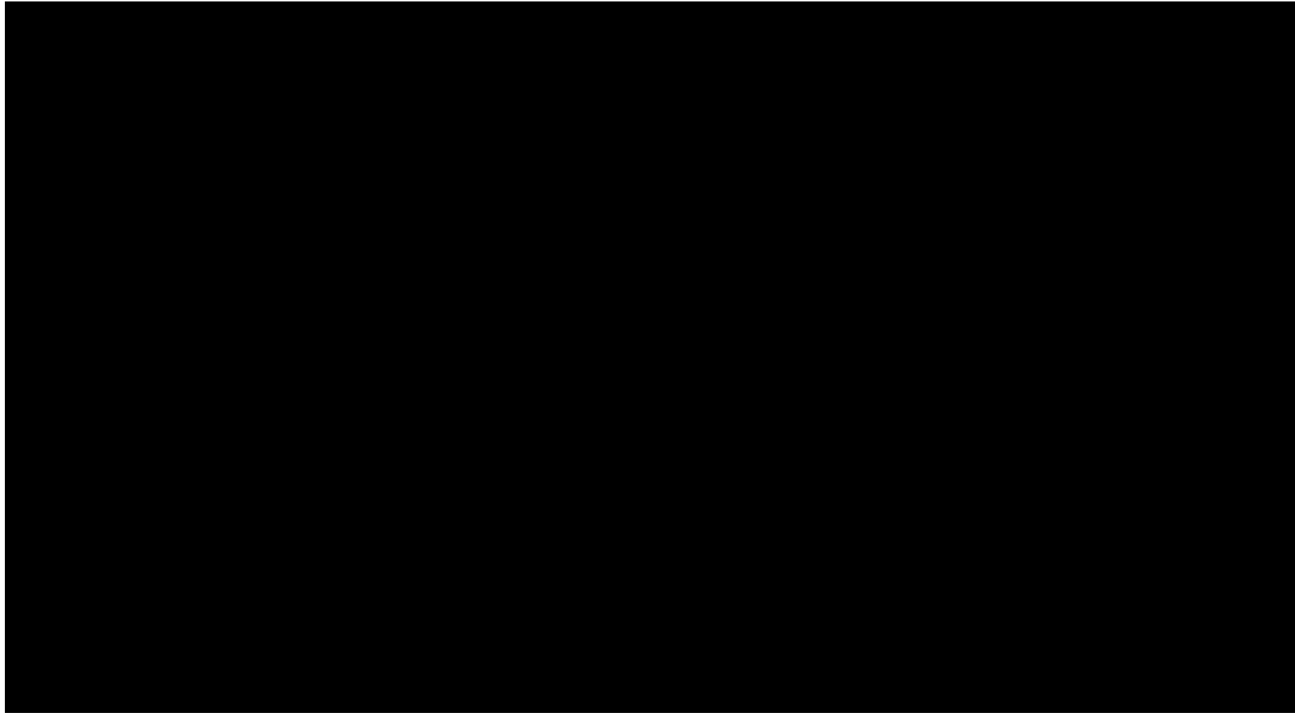
On 4 February a criminal court in Asuncion, Paraguay granted a Colombian request for the extradition of a Paraguayan citizen who was one of two individuals involved in the 30 May 1973 hijacking of a Colombian airliner. The extradition request was initiated in July 1973. In granting the extradition, the court cited the fact that both Paraguay and Colombia are parties to the Tokyo and Hague conventions. The hijacker's lawyer has indicated that the decision will be appealed. For background on the hijacking see the issues of 6 June, 13 June, 27 June and 18 July 1973. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Pamphlets were found at the scene issued by the "Arab Communist Organization--Lebanon Region," stating the organization blew up the Spinney Center because it had failed to respond to previous demands to distribute food in the organization's name. (See 30 December issue.) (UNCLASSIFIED)
<u>Date:</u>	9 February 1975	<u>German Mission in Switzerland Bombed.</u>
<u>Place:</u>	Switzerland, Geneva	Two explosions at the German Mission to the United Nations caused considerable damage but no casualties. Rumors that an anarchist group claimed responsibility for the explosions could not be confirmed, according to the police. (See Notes.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

Spain Pardons Croatian Hijackers

On 13 February the Spanish official state bulletin announced that General Franco has granted a full pardon to the three Croatian hijackers who were sentenced to prison terms in December. (See the issue of 10 December 1974.) The Croatians hijacked a Scandinavian Airlines plane over Sweden in September 1972, obtained the release of six other Croatians from Swedish custody, and flew to Spain. The latter six were permitted to leave Spain for Paraguay in June 1974. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Date: 11 February 1975 Lebanon Branch of U.S. Firm Bombed.  
Place: Lebanon, Tyre A bomb exploded at a branch office of the American Life Insurance Company in Tyre, causing extensive damage but no casualties. The Arab Communist Organization has claimed credit for the explosion. A leaflet found near the scene claimed the attack was a protest against Secretary Kissinger's current Middle East tour. The ACO has claimed responsibility for a series of previous bomb attacks against American interests in Lebanon and Syria and the British-owned Spinney's Center in Beirut. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Date: 17 February 1975 Grenade Wounds U.S. Boy.  
Place: Lebanon, Beirut The 11-year-old son of Robert Walker, chaplain and professor of culture at the American University of Beirut, was slightly injured when a hand grenade attached to his father's car exploded, according to police. The perpetrators are not known. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Spain Returns Hijacking Ransom Money to Sweden

Spain has returned to Sweden all the ransom money it confiscated in September 1972 from the Croatian hijackers of a Scandinavian Airlines plane. The Swedish government had released six Croatian terrorists from prison and paid a ransom of about \$110,000 to obtain the release of the hijacked passengers. The Spanish government pardoned the three hijackers on 13 February 1975 (see the 18 February issue). The money was turned over to the Swedish Embassy on 15 February, according to a Spanish radio broadcast. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Meir Kahane Sentenced in New York

Rabbi Meir Kahane, founder of the Jewish Defense League, has been sentenced to a year in prison for violating probation. The sentence was pronounced in a U.S. district court in New York on 21 February. Kahane had been given five years probation in July 1971 on a charge of making a fire bomb, and was expressly forbidden to have anything to do with guns, bombs or other weapons. Later, while in Israel, he plotted to smuggle arms from Israel to Europe for use in terrorist acts, and also wrote to JDL members in the U.S. urging them to bomb the Iraqi Embassy in Washington and to kidnap and kill Soviet diplomats. The Israelis gave him two-year suspended sentences for these activities, one in June 1974 and one in November 1974. (See the issue of 19 December.) He was allowed to depart Israel for the United States, however.

Kahane admitted in court that he had violated the terms of his probation, and attempted to justify his activities by saying JDL violence was aimed at preventing a detente with the USSR which he felt would doom Soviet Jews. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Layla Khalid Speaks at Kuwait University

Layla Khalid, who has stayed out of the limelight since she became something of a celebrity following a PFLP hijack attempt in September 1970, gave a lecture at Kuwait University on 21 February which was summarized in the local press. In her lecture to a few hundred persons, including some prominent Kuwaiti leftists, she emphasized the PFLP's "rejectionist"

line, saying that armed struggle is the only route to the liberation of Palestine and advocating the overthrow of the "agent" regime in Jordan. She also criticized the "rightist apostasy" in Egypt and Syria and the U.S. "threats" to Arab oil fields.

Khalid and another PFLP terrorist attempted to hijack an El Al plane flying from Amsterdam to New York on 6 September 1970, the day the PFLP successfully hijacked three other aircraft to Jordan and Egypt. A security guard on the plane wounded Khalid and killed her companion. The plane landed at London, where Khalid was taken into custody. She was released a few weeks later as part of a bargain for the release of the remaining hostages held by the PFLP. She also participated in the hijacking of a TWA plane to Syria in August 1969.

Date: 20 February 1975 Turkish Airlines Offices in Beirut Bombed.  
Place: Lebanon, Beirut The Turkish airlines offices were seriously damaged by a dynamite explosion. There were no casualties. Date: 21 February 1975 Bomb Blasts Damage U.S. and Foreign Firms.  
Place: Argentina, Rosario Ten bomb blasts damaged the First National Bank of New York, the Boston Bank, the Bank of London and South America, Massey and Ferguson tractor firm, the New Italian Bank, and the German Roemer Laboratories and several automobile showrooms, causing two injuries, according to police sources. The perpetrators are not known. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Date: 23 February 1975 North Yemeni Airlines DC-3 Hijacked.  
Place: Saudi Arabia, Qizan A Yemeni Airways DC-3, while on a routine domestic flight, was hijacked by a Yemeni passenger who held the pilot at gunpoint and forced him to fly north. The pilot requested

permission to land at Qizan, Saudi Arabia for refueling. Saudi security officials were able to arrest the hijacker during the refueling. The hijacker is being interrogated and will be brought to trial immediately upon completion of the investigation. (UNCLASSIFIED)
