

Yemeni Hijacker Sentenced to Life Imprisonment

The Yemeni hijacker who seized a Yemeni Airways plane on a domestic flight on 23 February, forcing the pilot to fly north and finally landing at Qizan, Saudi Arabia, was immediately brought to trial on 25 February after Saudi authorities returned him to Sana. (See the 25 February issue, page A-1 for information on the hijacking.) A sentence of death was widely predicted, but on 26 February a delegation from the hijacker's tribe slaughtered a camel at Sana's Republican Palace, signifying the tribe's acceptance of responsibility and pleading for clemency. A Yemen Arab Republic court sentenced the hijacker to death on 2 March, but the Military Command Council commuted the sentence later the same day to life imprisonment.

Under interrogation the hijacker said he asked the pilot to fly to Abu Dhabi. He admitted the purpose of the hijacking was to pressure the YAR government into paying pensions to the families of his brother and uncle, who died in the Yemeni 1962 civil war. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Prime Minister den Uyl of The Netherlands acknowledged in Parliament on 26 February that his government has given up hope of recovering from Syria the \$300,000 ransom paid to Japanese Red Army terrorists last September to free French Embassy hostages. JDL Leader Indicted for Public Threat to Arafat

Russell Kelner, a leader of the Jewish Defense League, was indicted in New York on 27 February on a charge of transmitting an assassination threat in interstate commerce. In a news conference on 11 November 1974, just before Fatah/PLO chief Yasir Arafat's visit to the United Nations, Kelner said that the JDL had "trained men who will make sure that Arafat and his lieutenants do not leave New York alive." 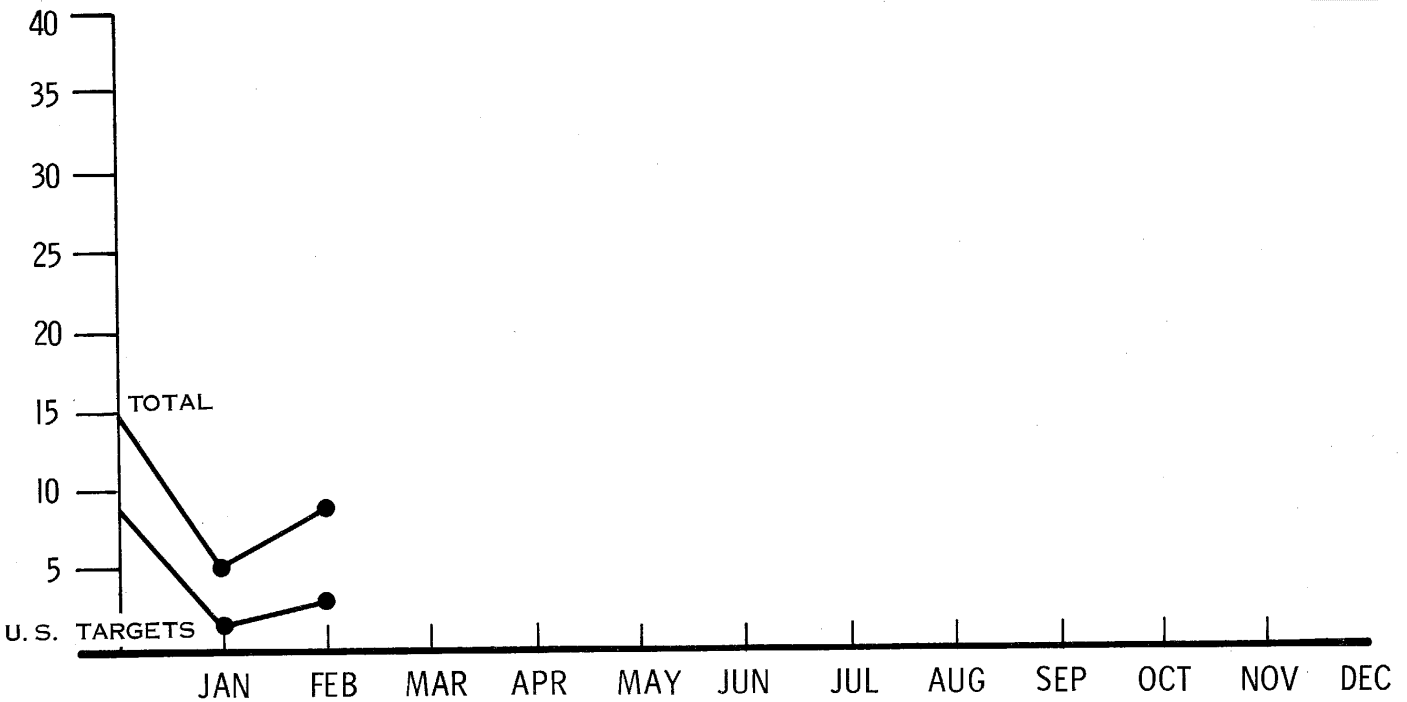

CHRONOLOGY OF SIGNIFICANT INTERNATIONAL TERRORIST ACTS

Date: 26 February 1975 U.S. Consul Murdered by Leftist Guerrillas.
Place: Argentina, Cordoba The U.S. Consular Agent in Cordoba, John Patrick Egan, was kidnapped by a group of armed men who reportedly are members of the left-wing Montoneros guerrilla organization. Forty-eight hours later, when their demands were not met, they murdered Egan. (See Articles.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

Date: 27 February 1975 West Berlin CDU Official Kidnapped.
Place: West Berlin Peter Lorenz, Chairman of the Berlin Christian Democratic Union, was kidnapped by a group of anarchist guerrillas who call themselves the June 2 Movement. The release of imprisoned comrades, a plane for their use, and a prominent person as hostage were among their demands to the West German government. The government complied with the demands. A Lufthansa plane and German crew flew the freed anarchists and hostage to Aden, where they were given haven. Lorenz is still being held captive. (See Articles.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

South Yemen to Expel Five German Anarchists

The five German anarchists who received asylum in the Yemen Arab Republic on 4 March in exchange for the release of kidnapped German political leader Peter Lorenz (see the issue of 4 March) have been asked to leave the country, according to an announcement by the YAR Ambassador to East Germany. The five were refused long-term residence permits and, according to the Ambassador, have already been asked to leave the country. There was no indication where the three women and two men may go after they leave South Yemen. (UNCLASSIFIED)

Pakistani Hijacker Receives Five-Year Sentence

A Pakistani student has been sentenced to five years in prison and fined \$200 for attempting to hijack a Swiss airliner in December 1974, according to a 10 March press story from Karachi, Pakistan. The youth boarded the plane in Sri Lanka and tried to force the pilot to fly to an Arab country. The plane landed at Karachi, however, and the hijacker was overpowered and arrested. (See the 3 December issue.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

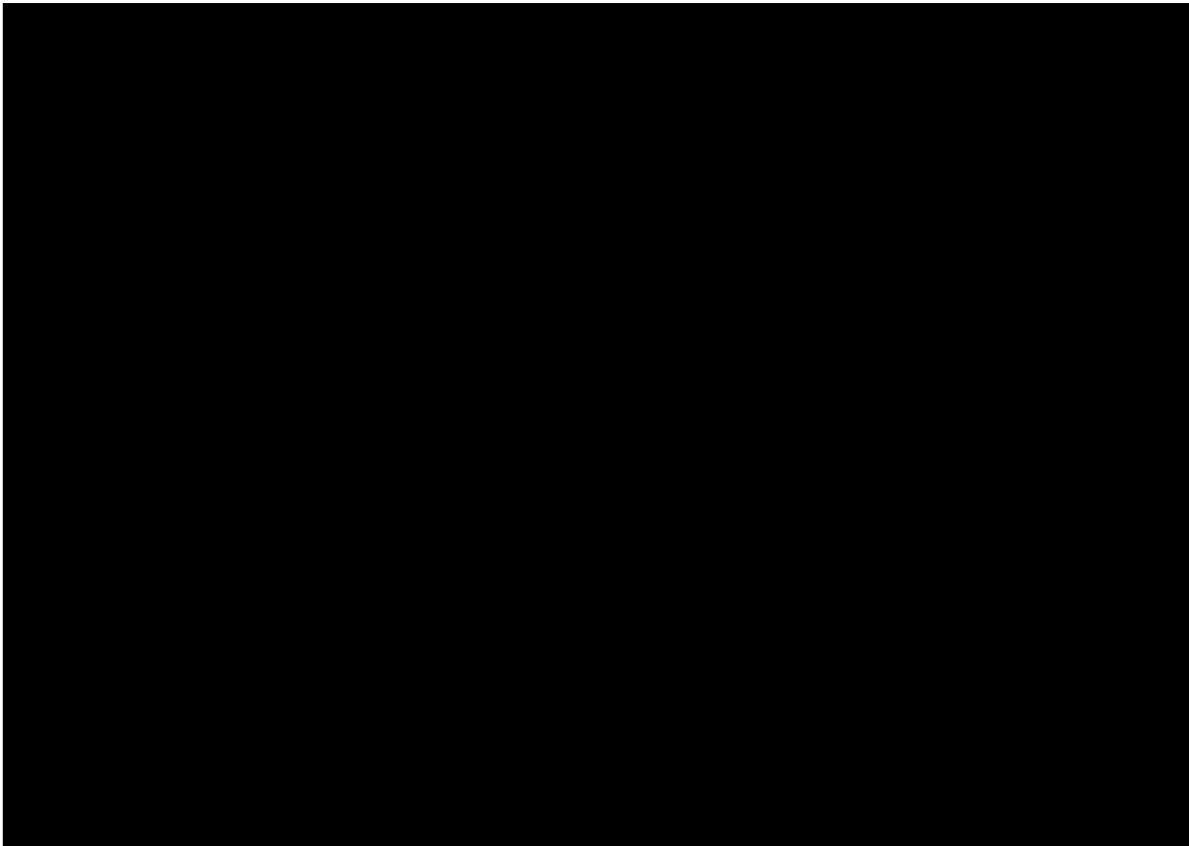

Fatah Attacks Hotel in Tel Aviv.

Eight Fatah guerrillas who landed from the sea seized the Savoy Hotel and held 10 hostages. The terrorists attempted to negotiate with the Israeli authorities with no success. Later Israeli forces stormed the hotel and seized the one remaining terrorist. In all, 18 persons were killed and several others wounded. (See Articles.) (UNCLASSIFIED)

A packet of explosives was hurled into the garden of the U.S. Consulate in Istanbul, only partially exploding. No damage was caused. Three Letter Bombs Mailed in Beirut

Two letter bombs surfaced in a Beirut post office on 10 March. One exploded and wounded a postal employee; the other bomb was defused when discovered. The following day a letter bomb which had been delivered to a Beirut lawyer exploded and severely injured the person who opened it. Investigating authorities have disclosed that the three letters bore the return address of a person killed two weeks ago. Authorities believe that since the letters originated in Beirut, the motive behind them was local political discord. There is no evidence to connect them with fedayeen terrorism. (UNCLASSIFIED)
