The 19-year-old daughter of an American Mennonite missionary who was abducted from her home in Buenos Aires on 13 September has now been located.

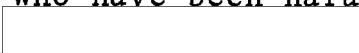

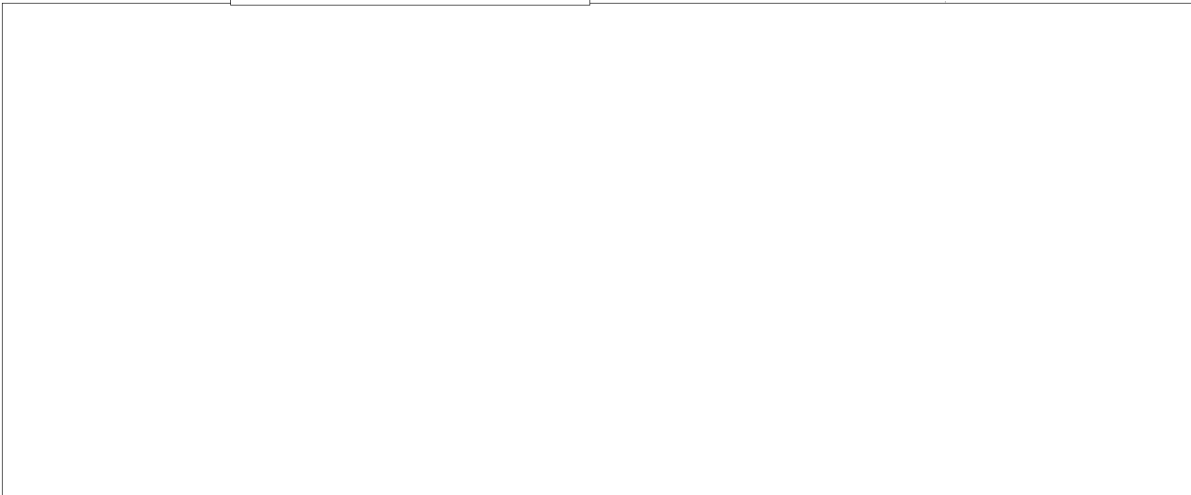

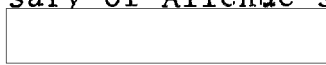
Date: 9 September 1976

Arson at Chilean Embassy in Vienna

Place: Austria, Vienna

A fire set in a Vienna office building caused minor damage to the entrance of the Chilean embassy. The persons responsible are not known, but police assumed the arsonists were members of a radical youth group intent on marking the anniversary of Allende's overthrow.

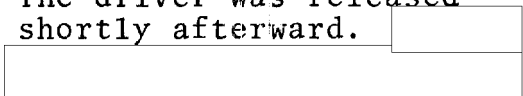

U.S. Businessman Kidnapped in Colombia

Place: Colombia

Gustavo Curtis, the American manager of the U.S.-owned Beatrice Foods Company subsidiary in Colombia, was kidnapped in Bogota by unknown persons. Curtis and his chauffeur were both abducted after their car was rammed on a Bogota street. The driver was released shortly afterward.

Syrian Arab Airline offices in Rawalpindi and Karachi were firebombed by unknown persons on 30 September. The Rawalpindi office was not seriously damaged; however, the Karachi office
