MEMORANDUM FOR CHAIRMAN, TECHNICAL SURVEILLANCE COUNTERMEASURES COMMITTEE

SUBJECT

: Study of Possible Measures to Deal with the Problem of Kidnapping in Foreign Countries

- l. In executive session at the 9 April USIB meeting, the Director of Control Intelligence informed the Board that the Secretary of State had inquired whether the intelligence community could provide any assistance in dealing with the problem of kidnappings oversees. Mr. Helms suggested that the Board consider undertaking a study of this problem to determine what might be done, assigning it to an appropriate bedy such as the Technical Surveillance Countermeasures Committee. The USIB concurred in this proposal.
- 2. Accordingly, the Chairman of USIB requested that the Chairman, TSCC, sponsor a study of possible measures to deal with the problem of kidnapping in foreign countries, including consideration of any gadgetry, ideas, protective means or other feasible actions. Mr. Helms stressed that, in view of the high level interest, this study should preced posthasts, with a report to the Board at the earliest practicable date.
