Mike Epstein, staff aide on the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence to Senator William Hathaway (D., Maine), visited Headquarters to discuss an agenda for the Senator's visit to Headquarters on 16 December. STAT In summary, the first question Epstein raised was what written directives are given to station chiefs in the area of covert activity which define or limit what they can or cannot do. He expressed the view that without such specific directions, station chiefs could, without consulting Headquarters, possibly stumble into a situation which could have international repercussions. He suggested that Senator Hathaway be presented with the exact directives or else be advised on the nature of Headquarters contact and station discipline which exists to prevent such situations.
