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8. (Unclassified - DFM) LIAISON Called Ed Levine, Senator Clifford Case's (R., N. J.) designee on the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, and we agreed he could begin his review of DDO reports relating to [redacted] on Thursday afternoon, 30 December 1976.

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9. (Unclassified - DFM) LIAISON In the absence of Howard Liebengood, Minority Staff Director, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, talked to Mike Epstein, also of the Committee staff, and told him that Ted Shackley, ADDO, was available to meet with staffers regarding [redacted] at 2:00 p.m. on 29 December 1976.

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10. (Unclassified - RJK) LIAISON Paula Schwartz, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, called to request the mailing addresses for William E. Colby and Ted Shackley, A/DDO. I checked with [redacted] for Mr. Colby's address and suggested that she write to Shackley here at the Agency. When I asked her what the nature of the Committee's interest was, she said she wasn't sure, but thought it might have something to do with their hearing schedule on [redacted]

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11. (Unclassified - JK) LIAISON Received a call from James Fellenbaum, Senate Appropriations Committee staff, regarding the appearance of Director Bush on 12 January 1977. Mr. Fellenbaum indicated that the Committee wants a short worldwide intelligence wrap-up plus the Director's perspectives on his tenure in office and his views on the future direction of the U. S. intelligence effort. In addition, Fellenbaum suggested that the Director be prepared to brief the Committee on the two most recent covert action findings.

Y.) in which we refer Senator Javits to the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence.

2. (Unclassified - DFM) LIAISON Marty Gold, Senator Mark Hatfield's (R., Oreg.) designee on the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, had asked me for materials reflecting the Agency's position on the open budget issue.

3. (Unclassified - DFM) LIAISON Met with Howard Liebengood, Minority Staff Director, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, to discuss the Committee's inquiry into the Agency's activities. Liebengood handed me a letter he had just finished for [redacted] reflecting the Committee's request for Agency documents. 25X1

We also discussed the Committee's plans for review of Agency documents to be destroyed and Liebengood informed me that Mrs. Evelyn Chevoor, of the Committee staff, would do most of the ground work for the Committee on this problem.

4. (Internal Use Only - DFM) LIAISON Called Mark Gitenstein, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, in response to his question regarding guidelines the Agency uses in counterintelligence investigations where Americans are involved. I told Gitenstein that the relevant documents were EO 11905, the Attorney General's implementing guidelines for the Executive Order, and Headquarters Regulation [redacted] Gitenstein asked for a copy of the last two items. 25X1

5. (Unclassified - RJK) LIAISON Mike Epstein, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, called to say that Senator William Hathaway (D., Maine) was still interested in making a tour of Agency buildings, particularly Headquarters. He asked for some preliminary data before the end of the week and I said I would get something to him.

I told him I would arrange for a meeting for him and [redacted] SA/DO/O, to review the listing and for a briefing on what kind of reports are available.
