KHRUSHCHEV'S ASIAN TRIP--SINO-BURMESE BORDER AGREEMENT

- I. Khrushchev is due in New Delhi a week from today (11 February).

 Stopping there for five days, thence to Rangoon for two days and on to Indonesia for a fortnight.
 - A. Primary mission no doubt is to refurbish Bloc's reputation in this area which has been damaged by Peiping's obstreperousness.
 - B. Signing of Sino-Burmese border agreement and non-aggression treaty on 28 January suggests Peiping now willing to do its part.
 - 1. Burma for first time has Chinese acceptance, in writter document, of traditional boundary with two small exceptions which are to be worked out by joint committee.
 - Agreement has, among Burmese, already gone far to create impression of Bloc reasonableness and diminish fear of Chinese aggression.
 - 3. Settlement will reinforce Peiping's proposition to Nelsu that face-to-face talks with Chou En-lai will clear way for understanding on Sino-Indian border.
