SUBJECT: MILITARY ANNEXES TO NIE IL-4-41: MAIN TRENDS IN SOVIET CAPABILITIES AND POLICIES, 1961-1966

- to NIE 11-4-61 have again been produced in advance of the main tent of the estimate. A discussion of the Soviet ICBM, IRCM, and medium range ballistic missile programs is not included.

 The updating of these portions of the annexes is reserved pending issuance in early October of revisions to NIE 11-8-61. intelligence have produced some changes to last year's estimates. The announced suspension of force reductions has led us to conclude that for some time to come the Soviet armed forces will be stabilized at the estimated present level of about 3,000,000 men. We now estimate a more gradual reduction in the heavy bomber force due to our belief that air-to-surface missiles probably have extended the useful life of these directally positionarily the REAR.
