CONCLUSIONS

Chances are slightly better than even that Sukarmo will not be seriously hindered by the army leadership as he moves to reestablish his domination of the country. The army leaders -- particularly Nasution -- are reluctant to face up to a showdown with Sukarno; their greatest fear is the possibility of a split in military ranks and consequent widespread disorder, even civil war. On the other hand, there is considerable sentiment throughout the military for stepping in to prevent a return to procommunist policies and there may be plans for such action soon. In any event current student demonstrations or other public outbursts of anti-Sukarno sentiment could impel the army to act.
