25X1	Italy: Premier Fanfani's resignation on 2 February is the first formal step toward the formation of a center-left coalition government depending on external parliamentary support by the Nenni Socialists. Despite the strong support for such a move expressed by the party's national congress in late January, the Christian Democratic party's right wing will seek to block it by making proposals of programs which would be unacceptable to the Socialists. Although the Socialists will probably agree not to vote against the government on foreign policy questions, they will make substantial demands for domestic reforms and will probably expect to have a vote in the allocation of portfolios in any cabinet they would support. Cuba May Demand US Withdrawal From Naval Base At Guantanamo Bay

The "General Assembly of the Cuban People," a Castro euphemism for the mass rally scheduled for 4 February, is to "vote by unanimous acclamation" on the Second Declaration of Havana—Cuba's "answer" to the meeting of American foreign ministers in Punta del Este. In the First Declaration of Havana, in September 1960, Castro responded to an OAS warning against accepting support from the Sino-Soviet bloc by defiantly announcing Cuba's decision to initiate diplomatic relations with Communist China and the intention to continue relying on bloc military aid. In his speech on that occasion, Castro warned that if "aggression" against Cuba continued, a new "peoples" assembly" would be convened to demand US withdrawal from the base.

Castro and other high Cuban officials have always maintained that Cuba will not employ military force against the base, but that "at the proper time" Cuba will present before unspecified "international bodies" a demand for US withdrawal. This line was most recently repeated by President Dorticos at Punta del Este. The UN General Assembly is scheduled to begin debate on 5 February on a Cuban complaint of US "aggressive intentions."


