Afghanistan-USSR: Moscow reportedly has agreed to provide SU-7 fighter-bombers to Afghanistan for the first time.

A contract for SU-7 trainers was negotiated during a recent visit to Moscow by Afghanistan's defense minister,

Since the first Soviet-Afghan arms pact in 1956, Moscow has provided Kabul with almost \$350 million worth of military aid, including MIG jet fighters, transport aircraft, and SA-2 surface-to-air missiles as well as a wide variety of ground forces equipment. The Afghan armed forces are now almost completely equipped with Soviet material.
