



INDONESIA: Djakarta will request some \$640 million in foreign assistance during the meeting in mid-December of the Indonesian aid group. The amount, which would be for the year ending in March 1972, is substantially higher than last year's request. Multilateral organizations, such as the World Bank, will provide only about \$100 million in new aid and the balance will have to come from bilateral donors. Since the Suharto government took power in 1966 the United States and Japan have been Indonesia's major contributors. The United States accounted for 40 percent of aid commitments last year and Japan about 20 percent.
