Finland reportedly has reached agreements to purchase major military equipment for its air and air defense forces from the UK and the USSR. These deals are in keeping with Finland's long-standing policy of trying to balance arms purchases between East and West.	25X1
According to the US defense attache in Helsinki, the Finnish state council approved the selection of the British Hawk aircraft to replace aging Fouga Magistere trainers. The decision followed nearly two years of intense competition among entries from France, Italy, Sweden, and Czechoslovakia. Finnish officials will soon begin final negotiations with the UK for the purchase of 50 Hawks to serve as both ground attack aircraft and advanced trainers.	25X1
