The accused has had no right to demand that witnesses against him be cross-examined. He has no access to counsel, which is chosen from a court-supplied list, until 10 days before the trial.//

//Iran has always dismissed international criticism of these procedures as interference in its internal affairs. Although it still holds this opinion, it has recently seemed willing to alter procedures in the hope of dampening criticism.//
