- a. Tanker GORKIY, with cargo, westbound of Cape Matapan (N 36-23, E 22-29) [redacted] 50X1-HUM
 - b. Tanker GIUSEPPE GARIBALDI, with cargo, westbound off Cape Malea (N 36-25, E 33-12) [redacted] 50X1-HUM
 - c. Steamer USTIG [sic; possibly cargo ship USTILUG], with cargo, southbound in the Aegean Sea [redacted] 50X1-HUM
 - d. Tanker BUDAPESHT, with cargo, towing a large Swedish-built floating dry dock, and the DOBRYNYA NIKITICH-class harbor icebreaker LEDOKOL-2, northbound in the Dardanelles 50X1-HUM

2. The following Soviet naval auxiliary vessels were [redacted] at Ilichevsk during [redacted]
- a. PO-2-class district patrol craft [redacted] underway in the harbor near the South Breakwater on [redacted] 50X1-HUM
 - b. PO-2-class district patrol craft [redacted] at [redacted] anchor near the seaward end of the Coal Quay [redacted] three portal jib cranes, one labeled GANZ, can be seen on the quay, and a floating jib crane is alongside the quay); 50X1-HUM

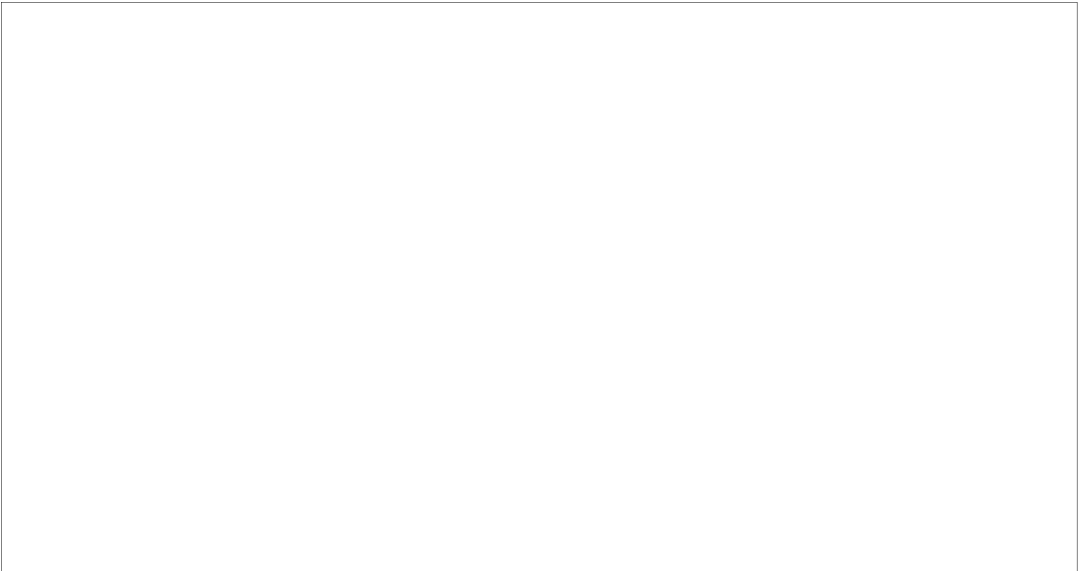
