General Background on Stargard

- 2. "Stargard is situated on the Ina River (German: Ihna). Because it was one of the most badly damaged parts of western Poland, It now has the status of a district town, with a population of around 12 to 15,000. (Before World War II, the population was around \$0,000.) The old part of town received particularly heavy demage during the
- 3. "There are no visible traces in present-day Stargard of its former role. It is connected to the Baltic Sea by the Ina and Odra Rivers and used to offer competition to Szczecin as a harbor. Although only a small river, the Ina used to be able to accomodate large ships. Only the old mill-gate (mlynska brama) and the salt warehouses are still there as reminders of Stargard's former importance.
- 4. "Because of its situation within a rich agricultural area, Stargard used to play quite an important part as a trade center and, to some extent, as a reprocessing center for agricultural commodities. Shortly before and during World War II, Storgard was transformed into a huge center of repair-shops for railway cars and C. 33. Prior to the war, workshops and railway depots were built in the northern past of town. After 1940, another one dees not specify what - an even 25X1X part of town. The Six Year Plan foresees the construction of a large condensed milk factory. From the information received, this construction has not yet been started.

6. "Near Stargard, in Kluczewo (German: Kluetzow), one of Pomerania's largest sugar plants is in operation. Very near the sugar plant are an electrically-run flour mill and a large brick factory used in the large town reconstruction program in Central Poland.

Military Role

7. "Although not very far from the large exercise-ground areas, Stargerd itself is of only limited importance as a military garrison. A detachment of the 43rd Infantry Regiment is stationed in the reconstructed military barracks. [In points out that the barracks have been reconstructed in a pre-World War II style.] This Regiment is a part of the 12th Infantry Division stationed in Szczecin. That this unit is motorized. The Stargard garrison is in deally contact with the tank regiment stationed in Slupsk (German: Stolp). It is said that some tank regiment supplies are kept in Stargard. On an almost daily basis, instructors from Slupsk go to Stargard.
