STORIES VARY ON TIBETAN
 EXPULSION OF CHINESE

REPORTS REBELLION CONTROLLED BY CCP -- Kuan-ch'a Pao, 29 Jul 49

According to reports from New Delhi, the Tibetan "rebellion" against the Chinese Central Government is controlled by the Chinese Communists. US observers of Tibetan affairs feel that the Tibetan "rebellion" not only evidences rapid growth of CCP strength, but also indicates that the Chinese Nationalist government is beginning to have internal rifts and that these rifts appear not only in the outlying regions but also in China proper.

TIBETAN PEOPLE'S GOVERNMENTS EXPEL CHINESE -- Kuan-ch'a Pao, 28 Jul 49

London, 27 July 1949 -- According to reports from New Delhi, local People's Governments have expelled all Chinese Officials, who have now reached India on their way back to China. The reason for this action is that if the Chinese government remains in control of Tibet, Chinese Communist troops will invade that country, bringing the miseries of warfare to Tibet.

New Delhi, 26 July 1949 (CNA) -- The Chinese Minister to Tibet, Lo Chia-lun, today denied to an Indian news agency that the Chinese government's mission in Lhasa contained Communist elements. The Minister stated that he is not a Communist and did not desire the infiltration of Communists into Tibet or any other region.

INDIA TO SEND OBSERVERS TO TIBET -- Kuan-ch'a Pao, 25 Jul 49

Singapore, 24 July 1949 -- An Indian government spokesman states that full reports about the popular revolt in Lhasa have not yet been received and a delegation will be sent to Tibet to ascertain the details of the incident.
