Kirgiz industry completed 98 percent of the third-quarter gross-production plan, including 104 percent by Union enterprises, 91 percent by Union-Republic ministries, and 104 percent by Republic ministries.

The Ministry of Meat and Dairy Industry, which exceeded the gross-production plan, did not complete the plan for production of butter; Ministry of Automobile Transport -- batteries and capital repair of automobiles; Administration of Industrial Cooperatives, Council of Ministers Kirgiz SSR -- bricks, lime, metal beds, cotton and silk fabrics, leather shoes, confectionery and macaroni products; Kirgiz Union of Invalids' Cooperatives -- aluminum ware, household soap, silk fabrics, leather shoes, hosiery, and knitted outer garments.

The following enterprises did not fulfill the third-quarter plan for assortment of goods: Sewing Factory imani VLKEM -- coats and short coats, and wool suits; Leather Plant No 1 -- leather belts, leather bags and gloves; Leather Plant No 2 -- sheepskin coats and sheepskins; Frunze Shoe Factory -- chrome leather; "Krasny metallist" Plant -- aluminum ware and ironware.

The third-quarter plan for output of main types of industrial products was fulfilled as follows:

The state plan for grain procurement was completed ahead of schedule by all oblasts of the Kirgiz SSR and a large quantity of grain was delivered above plan.

Many kolkhozes and sovkhoses which had a good harvest did not give sufficient attention to the speedy gathering and threshing of grain crops and are delaying the harvesting of industrial crops. As of 10 October, 94 percent of the grain-harvesting plan was completed by kolkhozes and 103 percent by sovkhoses. Kolkhozes harvested 30,000 hectares less than last year.

The grain-threshing plan was also completed less satisfactorily than in 1948, only 84 percent of the 1949 plan being fulfilled. Issyk-Kul' and Osh oblasts are behind all the others in harvesting and threshing of grain crops.

The harvesting of industrial crops, including cotton, sugar beets, hemp, sunflowers, and flax, has been slower than last year, especially in the case of cotton.

In connection with the delayed fulfillment of the grain-harvesting plan, the sowing of winter crops and plowing of fallow began later in 1949 than in 1948. As of 10 October, 48 percent of the winter sowing plan had been completed, as against 64 percent in 1948; and 12 percent of the plan for plowing fallows, as against 14 percent in 1948. Sovkhoses of the Ministry of State Farms Kirgiz SSR have also been less successful than in 1948 in fulfilling the plan for winter sowing and plowing fallows.

In 1949, most of the kolkhozes and sovkhoses were able to meet the plan for feed procurement. However, the republic as a whole had not completed the plan for feed procurement as of 10 October. Kolkhozes of Issyk-Kul' Oblast completed 79 percent of the plan and those of Tyan'-Shan' Oblast, 90 percent. Sovkhoses of Osh and Tyan'-Shan' oblasts did not fulfill the plan.

As of 10 October, seed grasses had not been cut on an area of 7,300 hectares and had not been threshed from an area of 6,100 hectares.

The third-quarter plan for daily average loading was fulfilled 121 percent by the Sixth Division of the Turkestan-Siberian Railroad, including 82 percent for grain loading and 84 percent for sugar loading.

The Administration of the Issyk-Kul' Ship Line, Council of Ministers Kirgiz SSR, fulfilled the third-quarter loading plan 113 percent, including timber loading 122 percent.

The Ministry of Automobile Transport completed 92 percent of the plan for freight-carrying in ton-kilometers, and 139 percent of the passenger-carrying plan.

The Kirgiz SSR completed 81 percent of the third-quarter capital construction plan, including 96 percent by Union construction projects and enterprises, 58 percent by Union-Republic enterprises, and 69 percent by Republic enterprises. The Ministry of Metallurgical Industry fulfilled 93 percent of its third-quarter capital construction plan; the Ministry of Coal Industry, 97 percent; the Ministry of Agricultural-Machine Building, 103 percent; the Ministry of Transportation, 123 percent; the Ministry of Petroleum Industry, 71 percent; the Administration of Construction Materials Industry, 48 percent; the Ministry of Light Industry, 57 percent; the Ministry of Meat and Dairy Industry, 43 percent; the Ministry of Irrigation, 65 percent; the Ministry of Local Industry, 28 percent; and the Ministry of Education, 53 percent.

During the first 9 months of 1949, the Kirgiz SSR completed 62 percent of the year plan for capital construction, and 50 percent of the plan for housing construction.

The Kirgiz SSR completed 90 percent of the third-quarter plan for retail commodity turnover in state and cooperative trade, including 83 percent by the Ministry of Trade, 95 percent by the Kirgiz Consumers' Union, and 99 percent by ORS and food-supply offices.

During the third quarter 1949, prices on kolkhoz markets continued to drop. As of 25 September 1949 kolkhoz market prices had dropped as follows, compared with the same period of 1948: meat, 25 to 30 percent; lard, 20 to 30 percent; butter, up to 40 percent; vegetable oil, 20 percent; potatoes, 30 percent; dairy products, 30 to 40 percent.
