## POPULATION INCREASES -- Hong Kong Wen-hui Pao, 10 Jul 50

Canton, 9 July -- The daily influx of people from Macao and Hong Kong has increased Canton's population by over 200,000 in a one-month period. The population in May 1950 was 1,361,215. At the end of June 1950, this total was increased by 130,000 persons working in offices, military units, schools, enterprises, and factories; some 50,000 transients; 50,000 hei-jen [unregistered persons]; and 262 foreigners.

A breakdown of the foreign population shows that there are 55 missionaries, 40 teachers, 16 doctors, 9 nurses, 14 students, 11 former diplomats, 6 workers, 3 engineers, 21 merchants, 16 unemployed workers, 29 women, and 42 children. The foreigners include 50 US, 50 UK, and 7 USSR citizens. [The nationalities of the other foreigners are not given.]
