WEATHER REPORTS FOR 23 AUGUST - 10 SEPTEMBER

23 August 1950. Sunny and warm during the day. Slight summer cloudiness will develop in the mountains around noon. Low east winds. Moderate north winds along the Black Sea. Maximum temperature, 30-32 degrees (all temperatures given in centigrade); along the Black Sea, 28.

24 August 1950. Sunny during the day, with variable, mostly heavy cloudiness. Low to moderate east winds. Maximum temperature, 30-34 degrees.

25 August 1950. Sunny and hot during the day, with slight variable cloudiness. Low, predominantly southeast winds. Maximum temperature, 32-35 degrees; along the Black Sea, near 28.

26 August 1950. Sunny and almost cloudless in the morning. Heavy cloudiness from the west in the afternoon. Moderate east winds. Maximum temperature in southwest Bulgaria, near 35 degrees; in northern Bulgaria, the Thracian lowland, and southeast Bulgaria, 28-30; along the Black Sea, 27.

27 August 1950. Sunny and hot during the day, with slight variable cloudiness. Moderate east winds. Maximum temperature, 32-35 degrees; along the Black Sea, near 28.

29 August 1950. Sunny and hot during the day, with slight cloudiness around noon. Low east winds (moderate along the Black Sea around noon). Maximum temperature in the highlands of northern Bulgaria, near 37 degrees; along the Black Sea, near 27; in other parts of the country, 32-35.

30 August 1950. Sunny and continued hot during the day. Heavy scattered cloudiness will appear in the northwest part of the country around noon, and will increase considerably by evening in the northwest border region. Slight summer cloudiness in the afternoon over the mountainous regions. Low winds (around noon, moderate), primarily southwest winds. Maximum temperature in the basin areas of northern Bulgaria, near 37 degrees; along the Black Sea, near 27; in other parts of the country, 30-33.

31 August 1950. Sunny and hot during the day. Local scattered summer cloudiness, mainly in the northwest Bulgaria, also over the mountainous regions in the afternoon. Low northwest winds. Maximum temperature, 30-33 degrees; along the Black Sea, near 26.

1 September 1950. Continued hot during the day. Considerable summer cloudiness will develop toward noon around the mountains. Thunderstorms, associated with temporary wind increases, will develop locally in the afternoon, mainly in the central Balkans and the Rila-Rhodopes mountain range. Maximum temperature in the basin areas of northern Bulgaria, 36 degrees; along the Black Sea, near 25; in other parts of the country, 31-34.

2 September 1950. Windy weather with scattered variable cloudiness, more pronounced in western Bulgaria, where light rain will fall locally in the afternoon. Maximum temperature in the basin areas of northern Bulgaria, near 35 degrees; along the Black Sea, near 27; in other parts of the country, 29-32.

3 September 1950. During the day in most of the country the weather will be relatively cool and very cloudy, with local light showers in eastern Bulgaria. Slight cooling. Maximum temperature in southeast Bulgaria, near 28 degrees; in other parts of the country, 24-27.

5 September 1950. Comparatively cool during the day, with scattered cloudiness, more pronounced in the afternoon in western Bulgaria. Minimum temperature, 13-16 degrees; maximum, 20-26. Low to moderate northwest winds.

6 September 1950. Very cloudy during the day in southeastern Bulgaria. Sunny weather will predominate in the morning in other parts of the country; considerable summer cloudiness will develop in the afternoon, mainly over the mountainous regions. Low winds. Minimum temperature, 10-14 degrees; maximum, 24-27.

7 September 1950. Sunny during the day with summer cloudiness, mainly in the afternoon and over the mountains. Low winds. Minimum temperature, 10-13 degrees; maximum, 24-27.

8 September 1950. Sunny during the morning. Summer cloudiness in the afternoon, more pronounced over the mountainous regions. Low winds. Minimum temperature, 12-15 degrees; maximum, 24-27.

9 September 1950. Moist and comparatively cool air will begin to enter the country from the west early in the morning. Under its influence, the weather in western Bulgaria will be predominantly cloudy, while light local rains will fall later, mainly over the mountains. The weather in eastern Bulgaria will be sunny most of the day. Low west winds. Minimum temperature, 14-16 degrees; maximum, 21-25.

10 September 1950. Predominantly sunny during the day in the entire country, with scattered cloudiness, more pronounced in the afternoon and over the mountains. Low winds. Minimum temperature, 14-16 degrees; maximum, 28-32.
