WEATHER FORECASTS FOR 15 - 21 NOVEMBER

15 November 1950. Foggy in the morning. Minimum temperature, between zero and 4 degrees below zero /all degrees centigrade/; along the Black Sea, near 2 degrees above zero. Sunny during the day with scattered and variable cloudiness, more pronounced in the afternoon and in northwest Bulgaria. Maximum temperature, 8-12 degrees. Light southwest winds.

16 November 1950. The cold air mass which moved into northwest Bulgaria yesterday afternoon will cover the entire country by morning, causing a perceptible reduction of temperature and general rainfall. Snow will fall in places over 800 meters above sea level. The current of cold air from the northwest will continue during the day. Under its influence, the weather over most of the country will continue cloudy, with local showers, mainly in eastern Bulgaria. Scattering and diminution of cloudiness around noon in western Bulgaria. Strong northwest winds. Maximum temperature along the Black Sea, near 10 degrees; in the rest of the country, 3-7.

17 November 1950. Predominantly sunny during the day, with variable cloudiness, more pronounced around the mountains and mainly in the afternoon. Moderate northwest winds. Maximum temperature in northwest Bulgaria and the region of Sofia, 7-10 degrees; in the rest of the country, 10-13.

18 November 1950. Moist and, for the season, comparatively warm maritime air will continue to move into the country from the west. Under its influence, the weather will be very cloudy; rain will fall, mainly in the western half of the country, and snow will fall in the mountains. Moderate east to southeast winds; later in the day, moderate to strong west winds. Minimum temperature, 2-5 degrees; maximum, 12-14.

19 November 1950. Clear during the night. Minimum temperature, 2-3 degrees below zero. Sunny during the day, with slight cloudiness. Moderate to strong northwest winds. Maximum temperature, 11-13 degrees.

21 November 1950. The weather in eastern Bulgaria during most of the day will be predominantly sunny, with variable, high clouds. In western Bulgaria, clouds will start moving into the country from the west early in the morning, later extending to central Bulgaria. Light to moderate winds, southeast in the morning and southwest in the afternoon. Maximum temperature in western Bulgaria, 5-10 degrees; in eastern Bulgaria, 10-13.
